## Sarah Harmer's 'I love the Escarpment Tour'



I uno winner and Burlington native Sarah Harmer is embarking on a seven city concert along the Niagara Escarpment to promote awareness of the fragility of the environment of the Halton and Niagara areas. The tour will start off in Owen Sound on June 14th and conclude at the Royal Botanical Gardens in Burlington on June 26th. Sarah will be playing acoustic versions of songs old and new with a blend of musicians. She and her group will also get a close-up of the escarpment along the Bruce Trail, and will be encouraging others to come out for a show, a hike, or both.

Sarah's motivation behind this tour started this winter was the result of an application by an aggregate company to rezone 200 acres of escarpment land. "I had been poring over studies, reports, policies, websites; soaking in all I could about the precious UNESCO World Biosphere Reserve that is the Niagara Escarpment," Sarah explained. "The Niagara Escarpment is recognized as one of the world's unique natural wonders. It is home to the oldest trees in eastern North America, 1,000 plus year-old white cedars and 40% of Ontario's rare plant species." The quarry expansion application in Burlington has forced Sarah to stand up and speak out. "We have been hard at work for the past four months setting up Protecting Escarpment Rural Land (PERL). The provincial government needs to ban new quarries and quarry expansions on the Niagara Escarpment. PERL is a growing group of concerned citizens who are working hard to protect the land."

After attending meetings with local Burlington citizens and learning about the application process Sarah decided to walk the Bruce Trail and put on shows along the way. "In this way we could get up close to the natural wonders of the escarpment, Southern Ontario's spine, and make music in communities along the way," Sarah said. "This land is environmentally sensitive and ecologically diverse and is one of only three locations in Ontario that has the international distinction and recognition as a United Nation's World Biosphere Reserve."

Sarah's "I love the Escarpment" tour will kick off June 13th in Tobermory and will travel down the Bruce Trail visiting Owen Sound, Collingwood, Orangeville, Georgetown, Waterdown and ending in Burlington on June 26. #### Star Wars, Revenge of the Sith
