NOTICE OF STUDY COMPLETION

Derry Road (Reg. Rd. 7) Watermain from Bronte Street/First Line to Tremaine Road (Reg. Rd. 22) Town of Milton

Class Environmental Assessment Study

To allow for improved watermain servicing of Sherwood Survey Secondary Plan lands, the Regional Municipality of Halton is proposing to construct a 750 mm watermain from Bronte Street/First Line to the future north/south collector (location to be finalized) and a 400 mm watermain from the north/south collector road to Tremaine Road in the Town of Milton.

This notice signals the completion of the Class Environmental Assessment - a study which defined the problem, identified and evaluated alternative solutions, and determined a preferred solution in consultation with regulatory agencies, and the public. This project is being conducted in compliance with Schedule B of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000). Subject to comments received as a result of this notice, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Region of Halton intends to proceed with the design and construction of the project. Subject to budget approval the construction is expected to take place in 2006.

Interested parties may provide comments to the Region of Halton on the proposal within 30 calendar days from the date of this notice. Comments should be directed to David Huk as noted below.

If concerns arise regarding this project which cannot be resolved with the Region of Halton, a person or party may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environmental assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below within 30 calendar days of this notice. A copy of this request must also be sent to the Region of Halton. If there is no request received by July 3, 2005, the Derry Road watermain will proceed to design and construction as presented in the project file document.

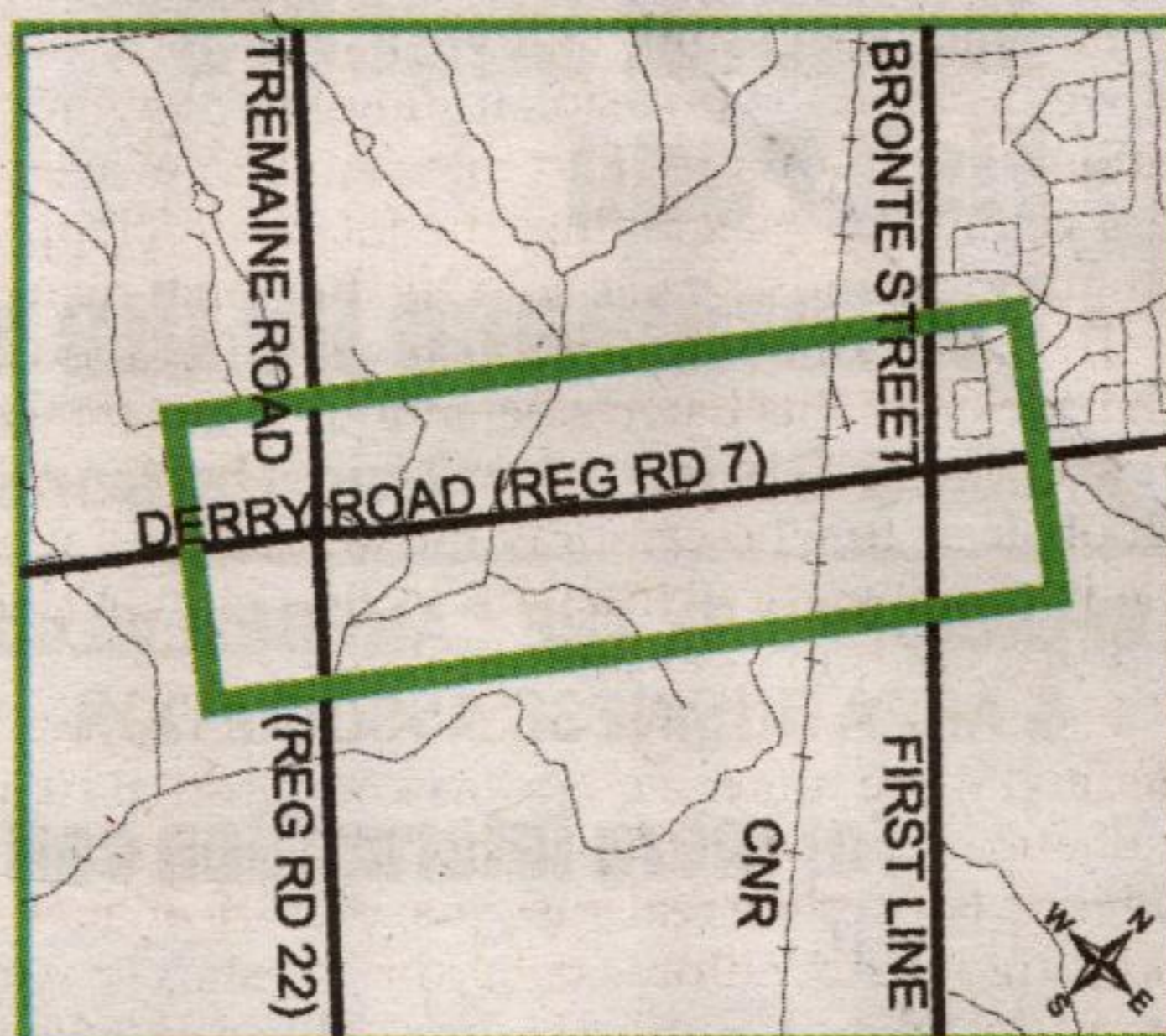

Tremaine Road (Regional Road 22) and James Snow Parkway (Regional Road 4) Transportation Corridor Improvements, Town of Milton

Class Environmental Assessment Study

The Regional Municipality of Halton is carrying out a Class Environmental Assessment for Tremaine Road (Regional Road 22) and James Snow Parkway (Regional Road 4) Transportation Corridor in the Town of Milton (refer to map below). This assessment will consider a wide range of options for transportation corridor improvements to satisfy future travel demands in the Sherwood Survey Secondary Plan area. The transportation component of the study is being conducted in compliance with Schedule C of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (June 2000), which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act.

A key component of the study will be consultation with interested stakeholders (public and regulatory agencies) at two Public Information Centres (PICs). The first PIC has been arranged for:

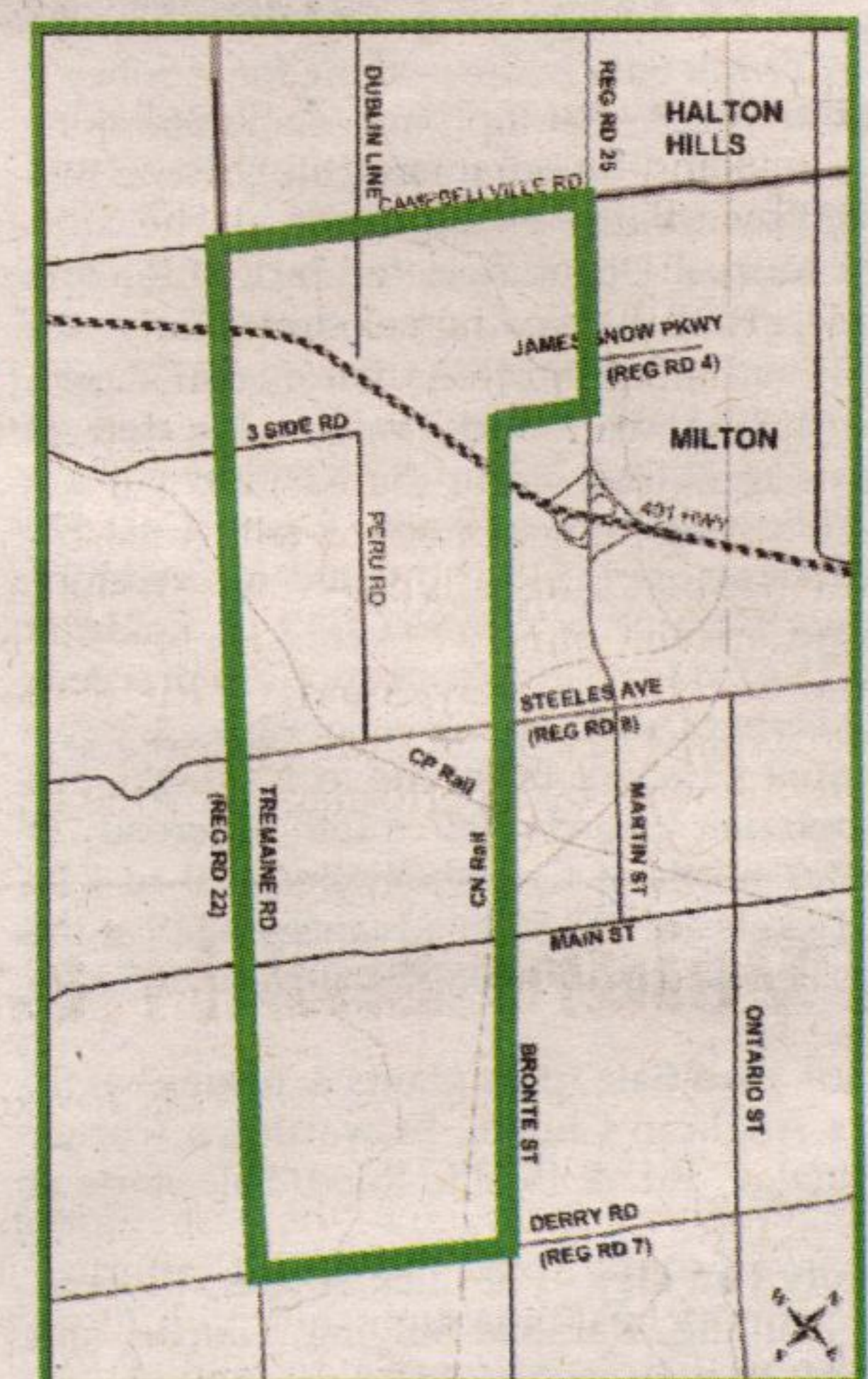
The purpose of the PIC is to review and obtain public input on the corridor alternatives for Tremaine Road and James Snow Parkway extension, factors for analysis and the selection of the preferred corridor. The preferred corridor is being selected by considering the Natural Environment, Social, Economic and Transportation Operation effects and impacts. Anyone with an interest in the study is invited to attend and participate. If you cannot attend and would like to provide comments, please forward them by Wednesday, June 22, 2005 to the Regional Municipality of Halton at the address below. Following the PIC, study findings will be reviewed in light of comments received and preferred routes for each corridor will be determined. A second PIC will be scheduled for January 2006.
