

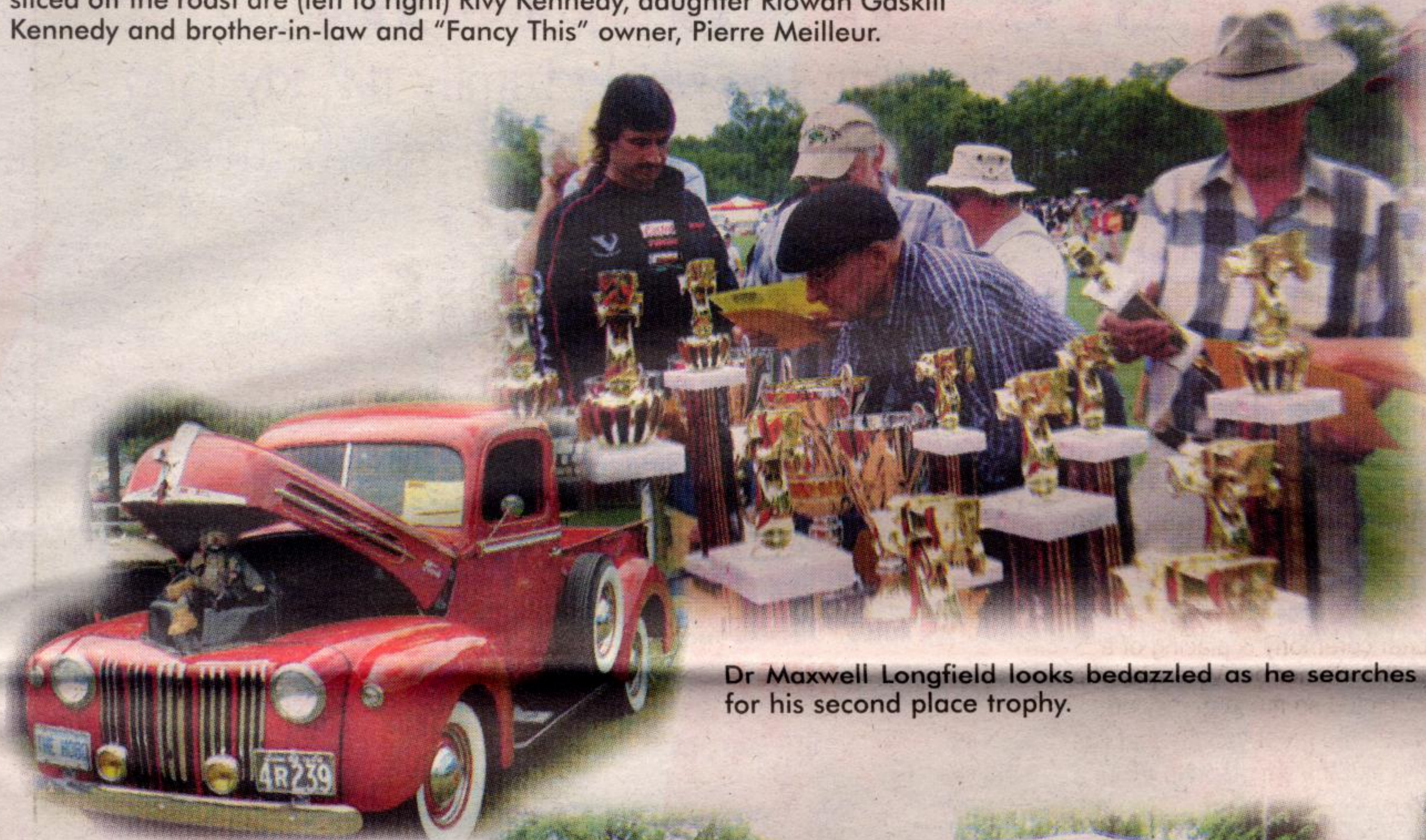
# 18th Annual Classics against Cancer CAR SHOW



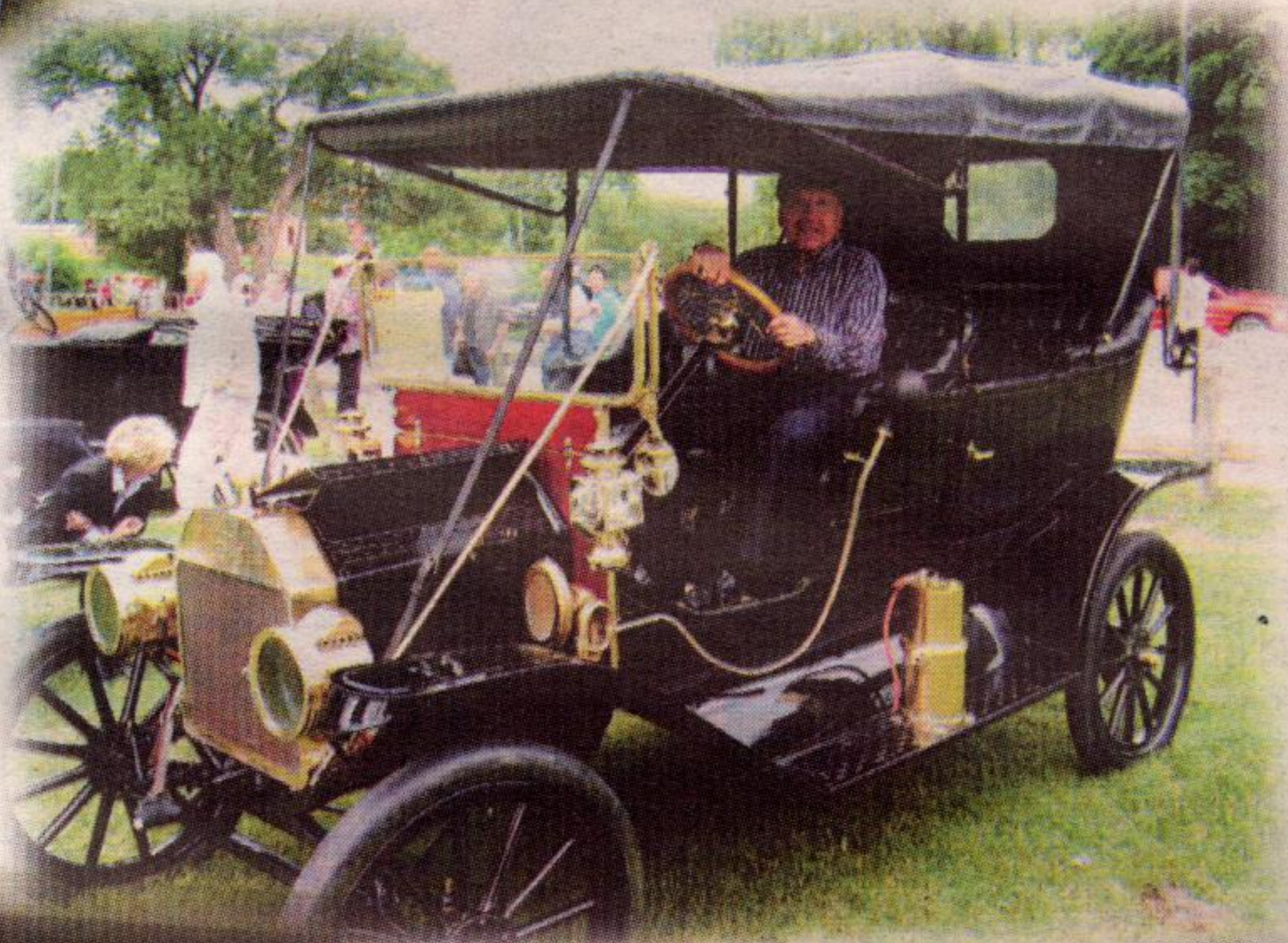

Dr Maxwell Longfield looks bedazzled as he searches for his second place trophy.

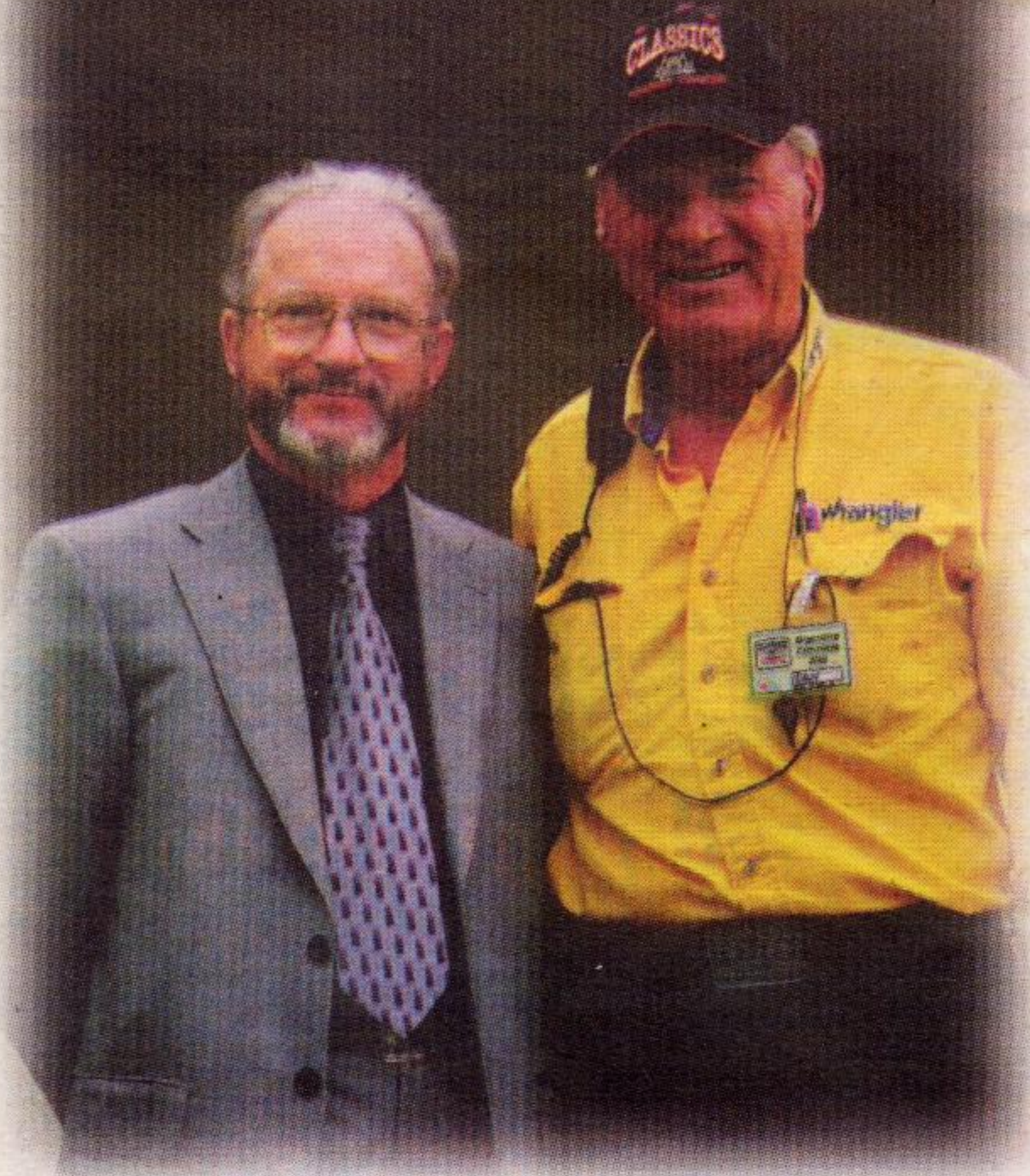


Dr. Maxwell Longfield from the Brampton area sits in his 1911 Model T Ford car.
