Acton High School students garner top awards at design competition

nce again Acton High School students have outshone their competitors at the annual Hamilton-Halton Home Builders' Association Student Design Competition. For four years in a row, technological design students from the school have won all the top awards at the competition.

This year at the awards dinner held on June 8 in Hamilton, first place in the small house design category (for houses up to 125 square metres in size) was awarded to Craig Kirkwood and second place in the same category to Dylan McPhail. In the custom house design category (for houses up to 366 square metres in size), first place went to Brenda Brophy and second place to Angela Henderson. Many Acton students also received honourable mentions or school submission awards.

Each year the competition gives students the opportunity to explore opportunities in the construction industry, but students also receive valuable feedback from people actually working in the industry, according to Norbert Axtmann, who teaches technological design at Acton High School. Axtmann says the industry recognition is also useful to him as a teacher because he knows that he's doing something right in the classroom.

Acton students competed with students from four other high schools from southern Ontario, but they were the only students that submitted three-dimensional renderings and that's something that clearly impressed the judges, says Axtmann.

This year 21 senior students produced a full set of presentation and working drawings

and each submission was judged by builders, plans examiners from the cities of Hamilton and Burlington, and engineers.

The work was challenging, but also timeconsuming. Axtmann says it takes one full semester to complete a submission. First students start off with free hand sketching, then they refine their sketches and finally develop formal plans for both the exterior and interior, all of which meet requirements as set out by the Ontario Building Code. "They could all get a building permit. Essentially these are legal construction documents once they've been approved by a municipality," says Axtmann.

Axtmann says the competition is a worthwhile educational experience for students. "It provides them with a neat portfolio item that looks good to programs that have a design-related element."
