

A Liberal Point of View

A year has passed since Canadians voted in a minority Liberal Government, and yet another successful session in Parliament has ended. This session, we have seen an active agenda with the introduction and passage of some really important legislation.

The House of Commons' spring session has been extremely productive. We have had the opportunity to make some major advances for Canadian cities and communities, and children and seniors, all while ensuring a balanced budget. Since the 38th Parliament began, this government has introduced 69 bills, 32 of which have received Royal Assent. This is a record that is comparable to the legislative achievements of majority governments in the 1980s and the 1990s, and is substantially better than the record of previous minority Parliaments.

Our legislative agenda, with national programs such as the New Deal for Cities and Communities, the National Child Care and Early Learning Program, and the establishment of the Wage Earner Protection Program Act, illustrates that this government can work and plan, not just for the Canada of today but for the Canada of tomorrow.

The spring session included a successful series of confidence votes and passage of the main budgetary estimates. A high point was the House passage of Budget Bill C-43

and C-48. These Budget Bills provide the framework for the funding of major government initiatives such as the New Deal for Canada's Cities and Communities, a National Child Care and Early Learning System, and new financial assistance for students and seniors. Our popular budget puts money where it is most needed, and invests in our communities and families.

Confidence in the government in the minority Parliament has been challenged and successfully met 36 times since October 2004. At each challenge the Government of Canada has democratically retained the confidence of Parliament.

This is vigorous democracy in action. This government's record shows not only the ability to meet the challenges of a minority government, but at the same time, provides outstanding legislation that addresses the needs and aspirations of Canadians.

This government set out to work with other Parliamentarians in the best interest of Canadians, and that is exactly what we have done. I am proud of our achievements this session and I look forward to our fall session.
