## Halton Crime Stoppers volunteer wins Civilian Achievement Award

> made a tremendous difference to Halton Crime Stoppers," stated Bruce.

Vettese's efforts continued when she obtained a grant from the Oakville Community Foundation for a portable sound system, which is used for the new high school presentation program.

Vettese was also dedicated to raising funds for Halton Crime Stoppers new fundraising initiative Ride Against Crime Everywhere (RACE).

"She saw the potential for raising funds and public awareness and, in an effort that was nothing short of inspirational, she

ran with it. She single-handedly raised close to 50 per cent of the pledges. Donna doesn't think small when it comes to events like this,

she thinks big," Bruce stated.


"Her support of this event and her commitment to its success went above and beyond, dedicating untold hours to its planning and execution. The resulting benefits to the program are immeasurable."


