n Saturday, August 6, starting at 8.0 am Habitat for Humanity Halton will hold a framing blitz at 88 Queen Mary Avenue, Burlington, another step toward the realization of the dreams and hopes of a local family currently living in substandard housing.

Dozens of volunteers, including the Habitat Partner Family and skilled construction workers, will work side by side during the blitz swinging hammers to build the home's walls and roof. Framing will be done using Weyerhaeuser TimberStrand™ wall framing engineered to stay straight and true - important because the boards are moved into and out of heated buildings several times during the build - warping most lumber under these conditions.


