

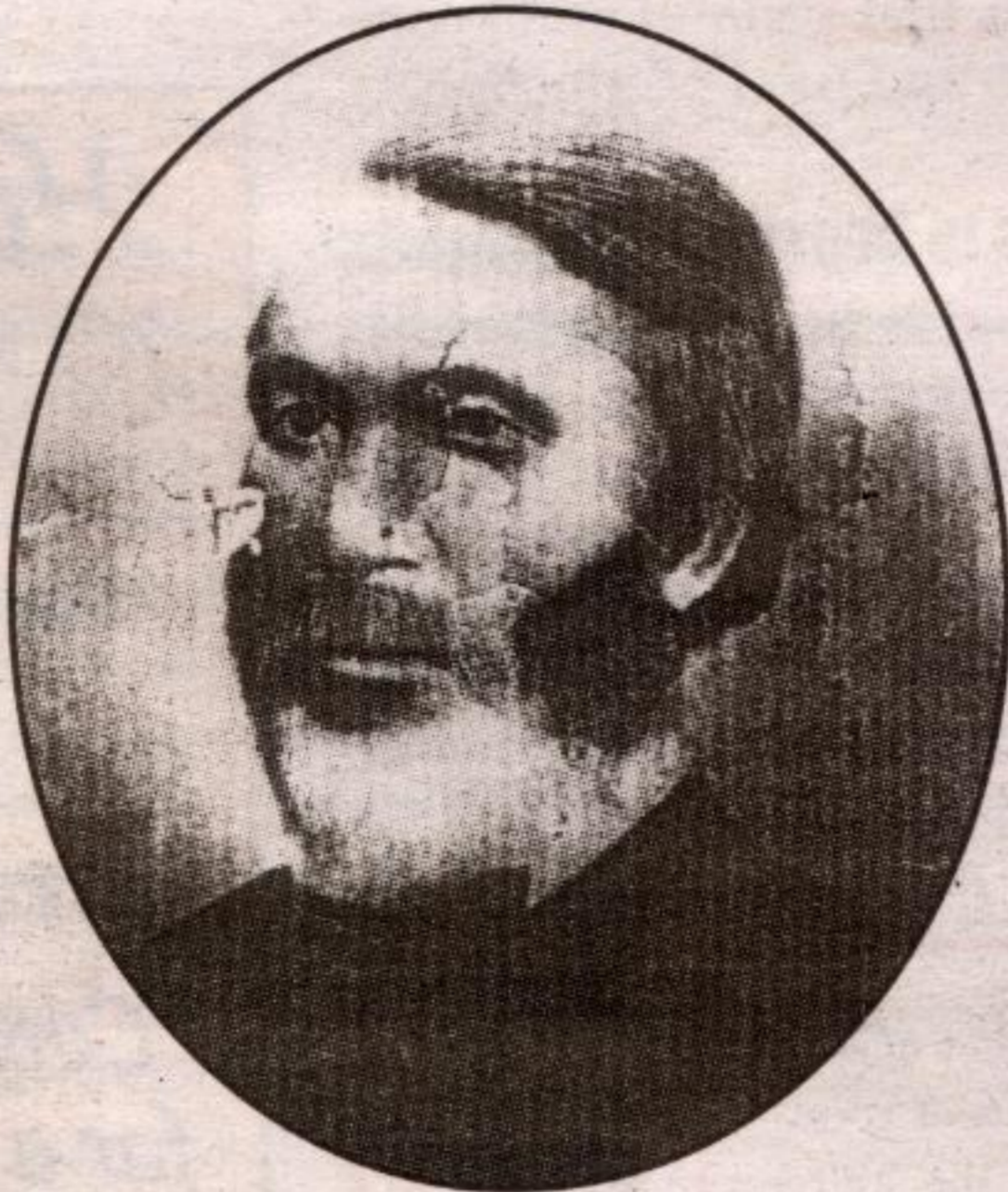

The Allisons of Lot 15, Conc.

The Allisons originated from Barnard Castle, Auckland Canada circa 1830. There were five brothers, Joseph, Rachel, with the possibility of two more children, Elizabeth England. Joseph and Hannah were married January 26, 1799 passed down that Joseph was a weaver by trade. Joseph George and John came to Canada and George, being the oldest Hannah. George and John settled in Nassagaweya Township from the Crown. George took the west half and John the east 1836 purchase from the Canada Company by John Allison.
