Age Appropriateness: Contains little gore and no language, but many of the plot elements are quite disturbing (cannibalism, torture, murder). Recommended 16+

I'm not qualified to review this week's only notable release (Madden 2006... I don't play sports games), so instead I decided that I'd look at a recent game that hasn't gotten anywhere near the attention it deserves. Jade Empire is an action roleplaying game set in the ancient China of myth. In a world populated by demons, sorcerors, and magnificent flying machines, you must rescue your kidnapped Master and ultimately decide the fate of the Jade Empire itself. The story's pretty awesome all the way through-I won't ruin it for you.

Jade Empire was made by Bioware, the same people who produced Knights of the Old Republic, and it has a lot of similarities to KotOR. The basic "wander around, run errands, be good or evil, save the world" formula is the same-the difference is that in JE, it doesn't feel like busy work. The writing is solid and the scenery breathtaking, so even the fact that you're playing errand boy (or girl) to the world never feels tedious; each sub-quest has real value and is entertaining in its own right. The main divergence from KotOR is the combat system. Whereas Knights used

a variation on the Dungeons and Dragons mechanics to resolve combat in a turnbased environment, Jade Empire uses a fully real-time martial arts system that stresses timing and constant variation of the many available combat styles, from Thousand Cuts' lightning-quick punches, to Ice Shard's ranged freeze, to the raw power of the Horse Demon transformation. Each of the twenty or so styles has its uses, and it's up to you to train the ones that suit your personal style.

I just can't say enough good things about this game. The plot is fantastic, with many twists and revealed secrets, and is fleshed out by good dialogue and really solid voice acting (see if you can spot John Cleese!). The combat is an endless thrill, as you switch styles constantly to fit the moment-to-moment needs of a fight. The graphics are some of the most beautiful I've seen on the Xbox, not in a technical sense, but in an artistic one-the sunset landscapes and sprawling cities are incredible, and always remind you of where and when you are. Jade Empire is my favourite game released yet this year, and hasn't been getting anywhere near the attention it deserves. The upside of that is that you can probably find a copy pretty easily. Go ahead, do yourself a favour... get your hands on the best RPG yet released for the Xbox.
