Thoughts?

It always amazes me how much power manufacturers can squeeze out of small engines. The current state of art makes 2 litre engines quite powerful. I think the 1.8 litre in the Toyota will generate more than enough energy and still deliver decent fuel mileage. Note: Honda just announced 197 hp from a 2 litre in their new '06 Civic SI. There is talk that engineers can make this engine produce 220 hp (R model) and still be reliable. Wow.

I drive an 87 Honda CRX. Lately when I refuel I continually smell gasoline. I haven't noticed any leaks under the car. The smell seems to clear after a day or two. Unfortunately, the fumes are giving me a headache. Any ideas?

Cynthia These are the classic symptoms of a fuel leak. Experience with this model tells me that the filer neck is leaking. This part has a tendency to perforate with rust. Have a technician inspect the entire fuel system for any sign of leakage while under the car. Bear in mind that the vehicle is close to 20 yrs old. Who says they don't build

### Food for Thought!

Recently I had the pleasure of speaking with a group of women about finances, and it was revealed that our relationship with money could be compared with our relationship to food. Picture a continuum, at one extreme edge is starvation and at the other binge/overeating, likewise with money we could label the ends as extreme frugality and extreme spending. These edges indicate unhealthy relationships with food and money. The area around the centre of the continuum is the healthy place to be. It is characterized by awareness, balance, control and power.

Can you strike a satisfying balance between immediate gratification (a winter cruise) and long-term needs (RRSP investments)? Does your money control you or do you control it? Have you gained the sense of personal power that comes with understanding and governing your financial matters?

Our relationship with money, our pattern of saving or spending, of worrying or ignoring, probably stems from very complex roots. Beliefs and behaviors concerning money are learned at a young age. Did we learn about poverty or about prosperity, about abstinence or abundance? How have our adult experiences affected us? What roles do stress and emotions, such as fear, greed or envy play in our financial decisions?

Keeping a healthy relationship involves being conscious of it, being aware of what works and what doesn't work and trying to change what is not satisfying or what is sabotaging our goals. By devoting time, energy and thought to

our relationship with money, we will stand a better chance of finding the healthy middle ground.


