People suffering from an anxiety disorder are subject to intense, prolonged feelings of fright and distress for no obvious reason. The condition turns their life into a continuous journey of unease and fear and can interfere with their relationships with family, friends and colleagues.

Anxiety disorders are the most common of all mental health problems. It is in 10 people. They are more prevalent among women than among men, and they affect children as well as adults. Anxiety disorders are illnesses. They can be diagnosed; they can be treated.

Understanding the facts about anxiety disorders is an important step. Realizing that they are medical disorders which can be treated will help to remove the stigma and encourage people with anxiety disorders to explore the treatments available.

hen federal Agent Derrick V Vann's partner is murdered, he immediately gets on the case to solve the crime. Cooler than cool, Vann (played by Samuel L. Jackson) accidentally winds up paired with Andy Fidler, a dental supply salesman, while trying to solve the murder. Amidst the search for the assailant, Andy's mistaken identity lands him in the middle of a sting operation with Vann and the adventures begin. Flying down the streets of Detroit, this 'odd-couple' type pair wind up in an array of situations, each more unimaginable than the last.

This unlikely duo produces many scenes that attempt to be funny throughout the film The Man. Between Levy's comic timing and Jackson's sarcasm, the two characters create a succession of jokes that are somewhat repetitive and

mindless. While the humour is not exactly clean, the film does provide audiences with some pointless stunts and simple camera angles which are sure to bore the pants off any viewer. Unfortunately the little humour that is present also tends to fall flat whenever Eugene Levy is off screen, creating a disappointing film overall.

With a running time of eighty-four minutes, The Man seems a lot longer than it really is because of the lack of plot direction. The MPAA rating says it all: PG-13, for language, rude dialogue and some violence. If you are looking for mindless bathroom humour and yet another buddy cop film, be sure and go
