## Halton Hills to streamline development process

Halton Hills Council unanimously approved a report that sets the groundwork for streamlining the development approval process in the municipality.

The report contains 38 recommendations involving all aspects of the development process. Implementation of the key aspects of the report will take place over the coming months. The report emphasizes the need for improved customer service, reduced

processing times, and designated leadership roles.

Mayor Rick Bonnette states, "with the tabling of the report, and its approval by Council, we now know what we have to do to make Halton Hills a desirable place to do business. With implementation of this report over the coming months, we can now state we really are open for business. I would like to commend staff for working collectively to bring this report forward." Mayor Bonnette adds, "This is one of the most important reports that Council has approved this term. It provides the opportunity for welcome change."

Halton Hills has traditionally had a low ratio of industrial/commercial assessment to residential assessment. The development of the 401-407 Gateway Business Park will spearhead the Town of Halton Hill's drive

spearhead the Town of Halton Hill's drive to increase the amount of industrial assessment. With projects in the 401-407 Gateway Business Park now a reality, the implementation of the revised development processing procedures is timely.

Communication of the implementation process is seen as paramount. The development industry, business community, and related outside agencies will be provided with copies of the report as well as briefings on the implementation plan in the near future.


