## Waterdown Book Fair fundraiser for Heritage Society

he Waterdown-East Flamborough Heritage Society will hold its Fifteenth Annual BOOK FAIR on Saturday, November 12th, 2005 in the Fellowship Hall, St. James United Church, 306 Parkside Drive, Waterdown from 9:30am to 3:00pm.

Local History, Maps and Prints, Genealogy, Canadiana, Second Hand and Antiquarian Books will all be available as well as local history books, including the Society's re-printed "Dundas Street Waterdown 1793 - 1993".

The Hamilton Branch of the Ontario Genealogical Society (OGS) will be selling transcriptions of the Hamilton-Wentworth area cemeteries, and additional 1901 census transcriptions. Neighbouring Brant County and Halton-Peel OGS will present similar resources for their areas.

The local Heritage Society will be selling its own publications of marriage records, obituary notices and directory listings for the Flamborough area. Copies of the Society's books, "From West Flamborough's Storied Past","... and they came to East Flamborough", plus "Millgrove Through The Years" and "The Mountsberg Heritage" will also be available for purchase.

Historical societies from Hamilton,

Burlington and Grimsby will have their own latest books and maps. Local authors Dorothy Turcotte (latest self-published book "My Brother The Zombie"), The Book Band (local authors, illustrated Christmas Story) and Gary Evans (local history books including 2005 publications "Hamilton at War" and "Vanished Hamilton") will have their many books for sale. Copies of the newly released Burlington book "Burlington Doctors 1800-1961" and a Sheffield history "Life in the Country' will be for sale.

Several area organizations and societies that promote history and heritage will have displays on hand and materials for sale. These include the Hamilton Branch of the United Empire Loyalist Society, Glanbrook Heritage Society (Glanbrook Township History Books), Grimsby Historical Society ('Annals of the Forty'), Dundas Historical Society Museum (Dundas history books) and The City of Hamilton Municipal Heritage Committee with walking guides and posters from surrounding communities.

The Mackenzie Printery Museum from Queenston will have a small printing press set up for visitors to view and try their hand at operating.

Dennis Morley of Guelph (Canadiana, second-hand books), Celia Perry (good second-hand books) and Natural Heritage Books (Canadiana, genealogy books) will also have items for sale. In the continuing tradition of this annual sale there will be many good quality hardcover (history, biography and art) books for sale.

For lovers of antiquarian material, first editions and rare books, Capricorn Books and Ephemera, John Rush Books and Alexander Gallery will provide a wide selection of collectable books, ephemera and maps and prints for personal or Christmas presents.

With this year's theme being "History on Parade - Youthful Inspirations" to encourage young people, ages 7 to 14, to read, particularly Canadian History, there will be additional children's book exhibitors, and two local author workshops in the Church's Parlour. Both authors will appear in period costume and read from / refer to their own history books.

James Elliott, writer, historian, former heritage writer for the Hamilton Spectator, at 11:00am will read from "If Ponies Rode Men" the story of Robert Land, a British Sympathizer living in the United States during the American Revolutionary War, who with his family escaped undercover to avoid capture and find freedom in Upper Canada. Joanna Emery, award-winning children's author at 1:00pm will speak on how she writes historical books and read from her latest works "Brothers of the Falls" and "Caring For a Colony: The Story of Jeanne Mance". The Historical bags with City of Hamilton museum passes will be provided to attendees and a prize will be drawn for at both seminars.

Door prizes provided by exhibitors will be drawn for throughout the event.

The above describes a sampling of the type of books and material available at the Book Fair. It also provides an opportunity for anyone interested in local history, book collecting, genealogy or even house restoration, to meet and chat with people with similar interests.

This is a fund-raising event for the Heritage Society in its ongoing work in the community and in operating the Flamborough Archives.

Admission and parking are free. Refreshments including an excellent selection of sandwiches for lunch will be available from the ladies in the kitchen.






