Wallace and Gromit: The Curse of the Were-Rabbit

Wallace and Gromit are back in their first full-length feature film entitled *Wallace and Gromit: The Curse of the Were-Rabbit*. When the wacky duo return, cheese-loving Wallace, and his faithful companion Gromit, are anticipating the annual giant vegetable competition in their neighborhood. "Veggie-mania" ensues for Wallace and Gromit as the two enterprising animals cash in on their pest control idea, "anti-pesto", which humanely repels pesky rabbits from the sacred gardens they try to invade.

When a veggie plundering beast begins to terrorize their neighborhood, attacking the town's prized gardens at night, Wallace and Gromit are desperate to solve the mystery. Frantic to protect the competition, Lady Tottington commissions Anti-Pesto to catch the creature and save the vegetables. When Lady Tottington's snotty suitor Victor decides he would rather shoot the beast and

become the local hero, the film takes a twist and Wallace and Gromit save the day.

Nick Park (*Chicken Run*), the original creator of Wallace and Gromit, and the director Steve Box, both do a fantastic job adapting the screenplay for *Wallace & Gromit - The Curse of the Were-Rabbit*. Peter Sallis is back in his role as Wallace while Ralph Fiennes and Helena Bonham Carter can be credited for the voices of Victor and Lady Tottington respectively. An Aardman production, "*Wallace & Gromit - The Curse of the Were-Rabbit*" is presented by DreamWorks Animation SKG and Aardman Features, and will be distributed by DreamWorks Distribution LLC. With a running time of eighty five minutes, this G-rated clay animation film is a surefire Halloween hit with children and those who are young at heart!
