There were no surprises at the Halton and Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference Cross Country Championship at Bronte Creek Provincial Park recently as Burlington's Notre Dame Irish and Oakville's Abbey Park Eagles continued their rivalry.

Abbey Park won three divisions and was second in two while Notre Dame captured two. Loyola of Oakville will also send a team to the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations (OFSSA).

Cameron Shortt of Acton Bearcats won the Halton midget boys title and finished second in GHAC, finishing the 5kms. in 18:25 sending him to Kingston for OFSSA Sat. Nov. 5. In third was Patrick MacKinnon of St. Thomas More. Acton's Matthew Biggs finished second in Halton and fourth GHAC and qualified for OFSSA for his second year. Georgetown's Christ The King run-

ner Sean Bower placed fifth and Milton's favourite Brad Hoy 12th.

Junior girls competition saw Megan Nederveen of St. Mary's (Ham) claim her third undefeated race at Bronte Creek in 15:34.4.
