

## Come Meet Children's Author Jean Little


ome celebrate Canadian children's literature (and meet Jean Little too) at Milton's Book Festival for Children! This family-friendly festival will feature book read-

udith gave her son a most unusual name, she called him Zayde or "Grandfather". She reasoned that if Death were to come looking for him, seeing a small boy called "Grandfather" Death would assume there had been a mistake and would leave the boy alone. Zayde also had another unusual characteristic, he had three fathers. There were three men in his small village who claimed him as their own and contributed to his upbringing.

This novel by the acclaimed Israeli writer Meir Shalev tells the story of hardworking Judith, a women who comes to a small Palestinian village to work for the widower Moshe. Moshe gradually falls in love with her as do Globerman, a loudmouthed cattle dealer and Jacob, a breeder of canaries who happens to be married. Judith never acknowledges any of these men as the father; since Zayde has characteristics of all three men he is never sure who might be his biological father, he just knows that all three men claim him, support him and love him.

Through the stories and actions of the three men Zayde comes to know more about his mother and about the sad life that brought her to a place where she would be loved.

Locations and characters are skillfully drawn and as the story progresses we feel we can see the streets and hear the voices. Daily life in a small village is represented well and Zayde's unusual situation is presented with sympathy. This is an unusual and beautiful story.
