Scanning the history of Trafalgar

here is nothing quite as evocative as an old sepia toned photograph. It reaches out to us, drawing us back into the past, encouraging a connection between what is and what was.

Creating a link to and celebrating Trafalgar Township's past is just what a group of local historians, librarians, genealogists, writers and others are hoping to accomplish by setting up a historical photo archive as part of the Trafalgar 200 Committee's plans to document, educate, celebrate and preserve.

"The only historical society in Oakville is very much about the south. We wanted to capture the history of the more rural and agricultural areas in the north," said Liz Benneian, a local writer and vol-

unteer with the Trafalgar 200 Committee.

Trafalgar Township originally extended to the lake on both the east (Winston Churchill) and the west (Burloak Drive) and then stretched over the farmland to the north all the way to Steeles Ave.

"It's a different, special and unique history," said Benneian. "As the land becomes urbanized, we're losing that history."

The archive is one of the first steps in forming what the committee hopes will eventually become Trafalgar Township Historical Society. The photos will also become part of a National Archive of historical photos accessible to everyone.

The concept for the historical society sprang from the idea for a 200th year celebration - Trafalgar 200 that will take place

in 2006 and was the work of Michelle Knoll, a north Oakville resident who was researching Veterans history for the Trafalgar Memorial.

With urban development about to take place on the formerly agricultural land north of Dundas, the committee is working to ensuring the past is not forgotten.

"It's just so important. Some homesteads have been sold and the photos along with them," said Benneian.

In order to create the archive, the committee has been holding a series of scanning days at the Oakville Public Library. The scanning days offer an opportunity for the community to bring their historical photographs to the library and then bring them right home again. If preferred, residents can leave them at the library and come back and pick them up

later. There are also writers on hand to record oral histories for the preservation of future generations.

"We're looking for photos of social events, history, family photos - anything that captures life from the past," said Benneian.

The first scanning day took place in September and the next sessions will be Wednesday, November 16 from 1 to 4:30 p.m. and Tuesday, November 29 from 1:30 to 4 p.m. and Thursday, December 15 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. at 120 Navy St. in Oakville.

For those who would prefer not to drive, rides can be arranged.
