To acknowledge Remembrance Day, thanks was given to the veterans in attendance for their sacrifice and bravery before the audience settled in for an evening of

entertainment.

Headed by lead violinist Arkady Yanivker, the eight-piece ensemble included first and second violin, viola, cello, double bass, clarinet, bassoon and French horn. Music included selections by Beethoven, Mozart, and Tchaikovsky among others.

Yanivker described the music of the serenade for the audience. "Serenade is writ-

ten for celebrations. It is the music of delight and love."

Highlights of the evening included Trio for Clarinet, Bassoon and Horn by François Gebauer. Bassoon player Joella Amar acknowledged it was an "unusual combination", but it was a treat for the audience to see these wind instruments step up from the shadows and take centre stage.

Concert goers are reminded that MCP's next concert, A Celtic Christmas, has been moved from Knox Church to Bishop Reding Secondary School to accommodate a larger audience. The concert will take place on Saturday, November 26.

The Long Long Way Sebastian Barry, Viking, 2005, hardcover, 292 pages

an there be a beautiful book about war, beautifully written but about that most terrible of events? Prose so clear and flowing and precise that it is almost like poetry as the story of war is told - the mud and the dysentery and the blown-up men, the shared cigarettes, the songs, the missing of families and girlfriends, the comradeship, everpresent death and the senselessness of it all.

Birdsong by Sebastian Faulks is one such book, another is The Long Long Way by Sebastian Barry.

Before and during WWI Ireland was part of Great Britain; when Britain went to war in 1914, tens of thousands of Irishmen joined the British army and were sent to Flanders. In 1916 the Easter Rising took place in Dublin when another attempt was made for Irish independence. The British government put down the Rising by using British regiments composed mainly of Irish volunteers who were ordered to fire on their countrymen.

The hero of this story is Willie Dunne who has joined the army because he is too short to be a police officer. Having fought at Ypres, having survived poison gas and shelling and the loss of many in his regiment, Willie is one of those soldiers who must shoot at "his own". Back in the mud of Passchendaele Willie questions what he has done. Is he betraying Britain because he regrets killing Irishmen? Will Irishmen see him as a turncoat for his part in crushing the rebellion? How will he fit in when

he goes home? Sebastian Barry based this book on the experiences of his grandfather. Short-listed for the Booker prize, it is a beautiful, powerful book about a war and the men caught up in a changing world.
