"We will match any competitor's advertised special or coupon in town," Thompson said.



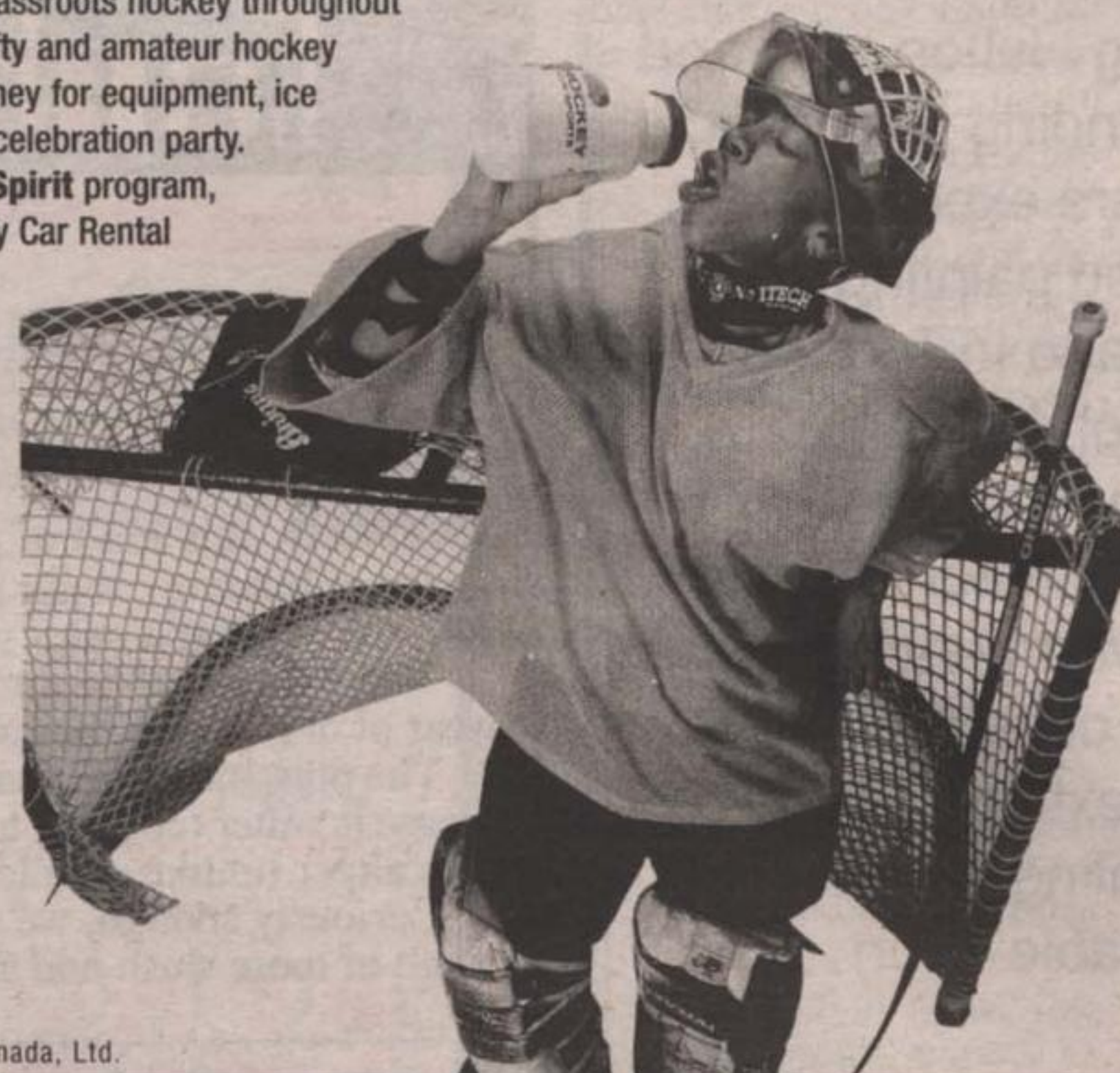
