Sabres, Trenton deadlocked in best of five semi-finals

The Acton Juvenile Sabres are tied at one game each with Trenton in OMHA semi-final playoff action following a 1-0 loss in Trenton on Sunday.

Although Acton is playing a best-of-5 game series, game 3 in Trenton tonight (Thursday) is critical because the winner will have the advantage heading into game 4 on March 14 at Acton.

Netminder Mike Kempton was superb in Sunday's loss to Trenton. Trenton scored its lone marker half way through the second period on a power play— a period that Acton played short-handed by two men because of a string of penalties.

Although Acton outplayed Trenton, they were unable to capitalize on their numerous power play opportunities and had to settle for the 1-0 loss.

"I couldn't have asked them to play better," coach Rob Pembleton said on Monday. "They played smart hockey and I know that they can do it again."

It took 10 minutes of sudden death overtime for the Sabres to clinch a 4-3 win in the first game on Saturday in Acton. Trenton opened scoring in the first period and the Sabre's came back when Trevor Malloy scored with just five seconds left in the first period.

The Sabre Juveniles moved ahead five minutes into the second period when Rob Turpin let go a blistering shot in the upper left corner that seemed to catch the Trenton goalie unaware to make it 1-1.

Phil McIntyre scored quickly in the third period

before Trenton retaliated with two goals to end the period in a 3-3 tie. This necessitated ten-minute sudden death overtime. Four minutes into the overtime period, Phil McIntyre scored single handedly to get his second goal of the game. McIntyre also set up two goals in the game with single assists going to Steve Forbes, Trevor Williams and Trevor Malloy.

Heading into tonight's game coach Pembleton said," Both teams are evenly matched and it's probably going to be a goaltenders' duel, "adding that he hopes the team gets the message that they must stay out of the penalty box.

"Basically now we're into a best 2-out-of 3 series. If we take tonight's game in Trenton then we will have home ice advantage on Saturday and this team loves to

play at home."


