Pros, cons of MAI debated at Town committee meeting

A federal politician and a environmentalist squared off over the pros and cons of a proposed global trade and investment agree-

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ment at Tuesday night's Halton Hills general committee meeting, leaving at least one Town councillor asking why the issue was even before them.

Halton MP Julian Reed, parliamentary assistant to

Trade Minister Sergio Marchi, touted the benefits of the proposed Multilateral Agreement on Investment (MAI), while Barbara Halsall, past-president of POWER (Protect Our Water and Environmental Resources), cautioned that MAI would eliminate many trade and legal barriers that now protect Canadian jobs and would affect local council's ability to do its job.

After more than an hour of debate on the proposed investment treaty Acton Councillor Norm Elliott complained that he was still not in a position to make an informed decision.

"I'm going to admit publicly right here that I don't know much about this subject, and I would defy the rest of the councillors around this table to say that they fully understand this matter."

Elliott said. complaining that any action councillors took on the issue would be nothing more than a knee-jerk reaction.

"The whole reason for raising this (MAI) is exactly what you said," Halsall told

Elliott.

"Nobody here knew anything about this thing and it will affect what municipalities can do so, I don't want you to pass a resolution tonight because I want you to gather more information so

you feel totally comfortable passing a resolution," Halsall

In his briefing MP Reed downplayed the concerns raised by opponents of MAI, saying that they were reacting to an unofficial brief that was circulating on the

Internet. Conjuring up images of Marco Polo as an early international trader and investor, Reed said that MAI is similar to 54 investment agreements that the Canadian government is now part of, except that it would involve 29 countries, members of the Organization of Economic Co-operation and Development.

"The world is going global and any country that says it an build a wall around itself and maintain the economic health of its people is just fooling itself," Reed said,


