Board Chair Jim Sherlock said the theme underlines how Catholic schools enrich the meaning of life, not only for Catholics and Christians, but for all of society.


Education week planning is still underway at St. Joseph's school, but it will hold an open house on May 6 from 6:30 to 8 p.m.

St. Joseph's Principal Robert Maggio said the open house will centre on the Vatican's Jubilee 2000 with a special liturgy.


"During the week parents are welcome at any time and we encourage them to come to the school and their children's classes," Maggio said.


