Steady nerves and deadly aim are Kylie Kruk's claim to fame and her superb bowling skills will be put to the test next week in Vancouver as Kylie, a 12-year-old student at McKenzie-Smith Bennett school, competes for her second National 5-pin girls' singles crown.

Despite an injury Kylie's solid performance last year at the Nationals earned her the bantam championship, and Kylie is confident, but not cocky, when asked to size up her competition this year as a junior.

"I'm confident because I've already done it and I know I can do it again, this

time without a broken finger," Kylie explained in an interview on Thursday.

"I'm more excited than nervous. They say that bowling is 80 per cent mental focus and concentration and 20 per cent skill. I don't have it all yet because I do cry and get upset when I don't bowl well, but I'm getting there."

Kylie will bowl 22 games in the May 4, 5 and 6, competition, meeting the best from each province in her junior age group. Kylie, who practices at least 10 hours a week, began bowling six years ago for fun with her parents and became serious about the sport two years ago after a second place finish in zone competition.

"I wanted to go back and

do better and I hoped I could win so I worked harder," Kylie said.

Kylie tuned up for the Canada-wide competition by bowling 219 to win the provincial title with in a recent tie breaking bowl-off in Kitchener

At competitions Kylie backs up her top-notch skills with a good luck charm and a ritual. The good luck charm is "personal" and the ritual is a pancake breakfast, prepared by her father, before every competition.

Kylie's cheering section at the Nationals will include her parents as well as Acton Bowling Lanes co-owner Darlene Labombard and Kylie's coach, John Wagg of Acton.






