Eagleton also hit homers for Renegades teammates Leanne Weber, Steff Serretta and Teri Miller played great games.


Stan Rhynold was named most valuable acrobat for the Beavers, who had a couple of


good innings early in the game, but crumbled under the Renegades' hot bats.
