

Public Meeting Halton Solid Waste Management Strategy

The Regional Municipality of Halton is inviting all interested individuals and parties to attend the second in a series of Public Meetings to discuss the development of a new Solid Waste Management Strategy for Halton. Representatives from the Region will be on hand to give a presentation and receive your comments and input.

The purpose of this public meeting will be to present Halton's Solid Waste Management Strategy Progress Report No. 1 for public comment. The report summarizes the technical work that has been carried out to date which includes the information gathered from the first public consultations and workshop. As well, potential alternative waste management strategies have been developed from the information received at the public consultations and based on the direction obtained from the public review of these strategies, they will further be developed to include costs and timeframes for implementation to be discussed at a second workshop to be held in September of 1998.
