## Environmental group appeals quarry decision

The acquittal of an Acton quarry for operating without a development permit on the Niagara Escarpment will be appealed by the Sierra Legal Defense Fund (SLDF) which says that it's the environment minister's job to uphold the province's environmental laws, not violate them.

In May a court ruled that United Aggregates Limited (UAL) - now known as Blue Circle Aggregates - was not liable for operating its limestone quarry without a development permit from the Niagara Escarpment Commission (NEC) because of a legal defence known as "officially induced error."

The court accepted UAL president Bill Burkhart's evidence that then environment minister Brenda Elliott told him UAL could continue to expand south of Regional Road 43 without the permit.

Four years ago the NEC. refused to issue UAL with a building permit and UAL was unsuccessful in two aftempts in court to get that NEC ruling reversed. Months later the Harris government made a major change in regulations to exempt all future activities in Escarpment pits and quarries that were licenced before June 1975, from the need for a permit.






