One Fairy Lake beach safe

The Halton Health Unit issued their water quality report on July 17 noting Acton's Fairy Lake's old beach was unacceptable for swimming because of the high

bacterial count. However, the report said the new beach on the other side of Prospect Park was fine for swimming.

Low water levels and the presence of water fowl con-

tribute to the high bacterial levels. Several beaches in Halton Region have been ruled unsafe for swimming. The lake at Kelso has been tested and is also acceptable.

Police warn of funny money

Police are warning merchants in particular, and the public in general, to be cautious of any \$100 bills they receive.

"They should get them checked by a bank," says Halton Regional Police Sgt. Jackie Gordon.

Two high quality phony bills with good holograms were detected in Acton in the past few days and Peel Region has also picked up a few. The bills do not have a repetitious serial numbers as is common in such situations, Gordon warns.

Acton man busted

An Acton man faces assault and drug charges after police were called to a Poplar Avenue home Saturday evening. The call came in as a domestic situation but upon arrival police discovered a small quantity of marijuana plants and cannabis resin in the home. The 37-year-old male faces two charges of possession for the purpose of trafficking and two counts of

cultivating as well as one assault charge. He appears in court in Milton on July 27.

Impaired driver

A telephone tip from a citizen with information about the way a vehicle was being driven resulted in police arresting an Acton man at Wallace Avenue and Regional Road 25 on Saturday evening. The man will appear in court in Milton on Sept. 21 on charges of driving while impaired and driving with over 80 mg of alcohol per 1000 ml of blood.

Man assaulted

Police are looking for three men after an Acton resident was assaulted in Prospect Park around 1 a.m. Saturday. The 38-year-old victim says he was walking through the park when he was confronted by three males and an altercation followed. He was taken by ambulance to Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital where he was treated for minor cuts and released. One of the assailants is described as a white male, approximately 30 years of age, 5 ft. 9 in. tall and weighing 185 pounds. A description of the other two suspects was not given.

Esso break-in

Operators of the Esso service station on Regional Road 25 south of Acton lost approximately \$4,000 worth of cigarettes, cash and a computer after thieves smashed a rear window and entered the building in the early hours of Friday morning.
