Club celebrates 30 years

Soccer lover and former Acton resident Colin Ager would be proud. The soccer club he began 30 years ago has grown into a vibrant, well-equipped club with approximately 480 players the majority under nineyears-old - and a dedicated coaching staff of 48.

The Acton Soccer Club celebrated three decades of operation with a video dance on Saturday at the Legion and on Sunday the championship games for each of the older divisions were played at McKenzie-Smith Bennett.

"The Club has been steadily growing over the past 10 years - partially due to our very active fund raising which allowed us to buy better equipment and offer our coaches training sessions," said Club secretary Anne Stewart in an interview on Saturday.

Stewart, first joined the Club 25 years ago as a parent of a player, said they were able to inject some life into the Club through the money raised at the Milton bingo.

"We've been able to hold clinics for our young referees

and we encourage the players who are over 13 to join the referees association and they ref the younger kids and help keep them interested," Stewart said.

Looking back over the years Stewart said a major change occurred in 1978 when girls were allowed to join the Club. Girls make up approximately onethird of the Club's members this year.

"We fought for about two years to get the girls to play. It was the old boys' club and there was no room on the soccer field for females until Richard

Kilpatrick, who had two sons playing and a daughter who wanted to, helped us convince the executive to allow the girls to join," Stewart recalled.

Girls and boys play together on the Under-7 developmental teams and older girls play in the G.I.R.L.S. for Girls In Rural League Soccer - association against teams from surrounding communities including Brampton and Grand Valley.

Stewart expects to match this season's success next year with generous sponsors, dedicated coaches and enthusiastic parents and players.
