





transmitting the virus.

According to Dr. Nosal, "We are working with family physicians, pharmacists and other health professionals to make sure that those who should have the vaccine know about it and know where to get it. We have posted reminders in community and recreation centres, seniors centres, libraries and other public places where seniors spend time. Our message is simple - if you are at higher risk of influenza and its complications because of your age or a medical condition, it's time to call your doctor for your flu shot."

Flu shots are also provided at reasonable costs for those who don't fall into the high risk groups and who wish to be immunized. For the first time, the Halton Regional Health Department will be holding flu immunization clinics in various locations throughout Halton. "I believe that if people are aware of the benefits of being immunized we'll reach our goal of 70 % protection," concludes Dr. Nosal.
