The team trains and plays in a Milton school but is having trouble getting the players, including three from Acton, to the school on Monday nights.

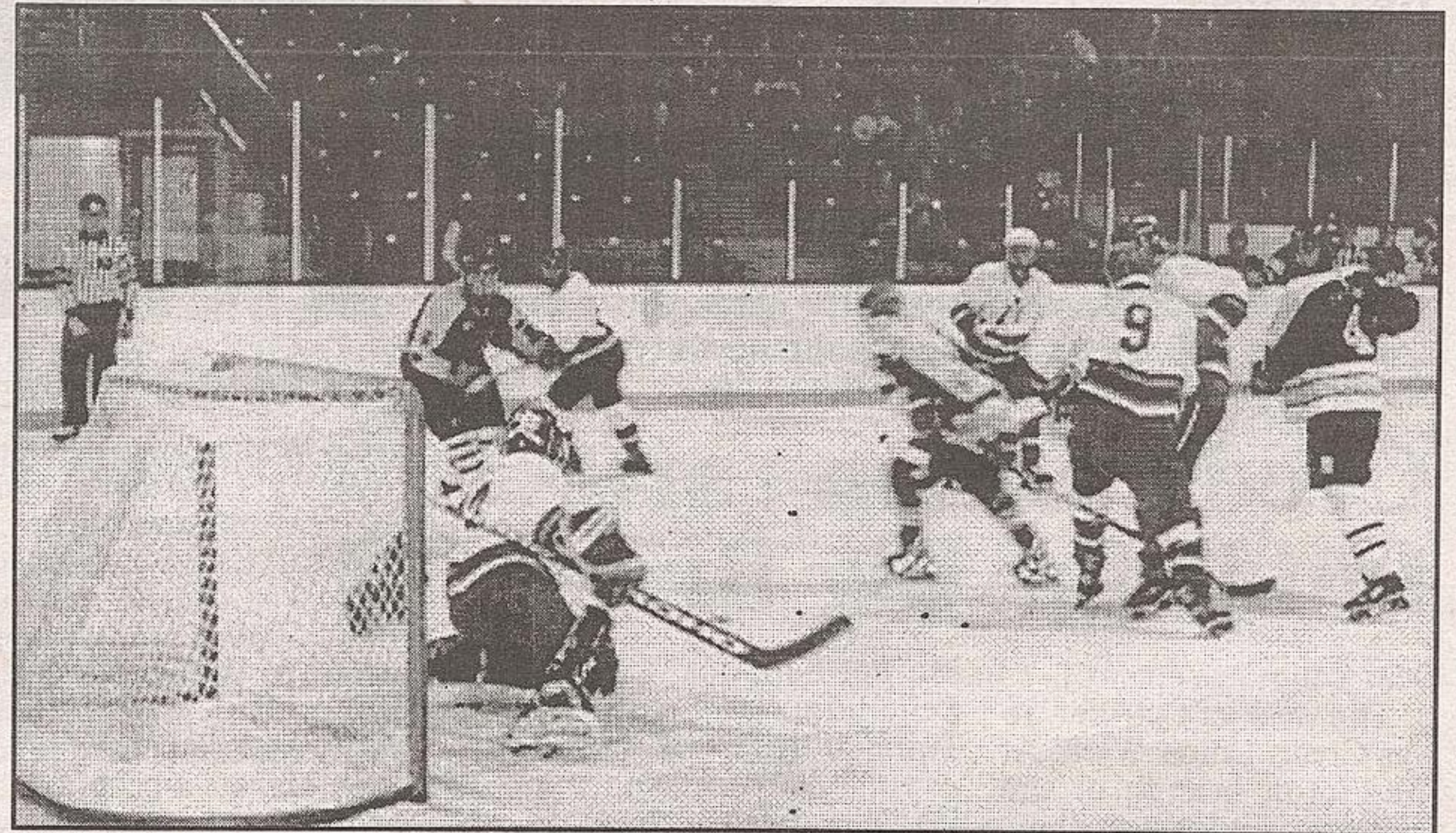

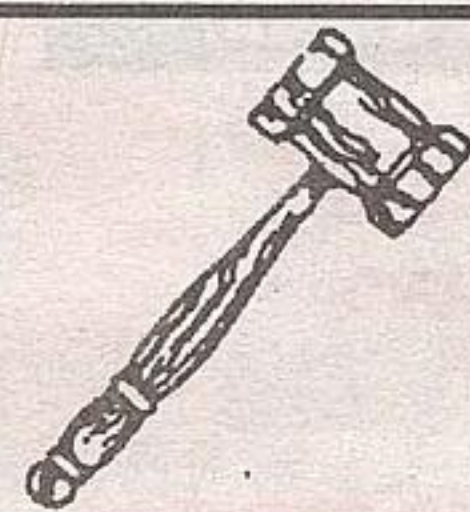
