



DRIVING SAFETY HINTS

Here it comes, WINTER, with freezing rain, snow, ice and cold temperattures. Great for winter sports, but very bad for driving. Here are some ideas for winter driving that could save your life or just be handy if you break

1. Keep your gas tank full.

2. If you are stranded you are probably safer inside your vehicle.

3. Carry a call police sign.

4. If someone stops to help, ask them to call police. Only roll your window down about an inch to talk through.

5. Do not raise the hood on your vehicle. This may draw the wrong kind of attention. Also, a raised hood blocks your vision of anyone approaching.

The following is a list of items which will prove very usefull if you are stranded.

1. A call police sign, usually available in the local hardware store.

2. Blankets and a large candle inside a car will raise the temperature about 10 degrees, and provide light to save your battery. Don't forget some matches.

3. A good flashlight. Make sure the batteries are good.

4. Road flares and a first aid kit.

5. Energy food, nuts, candy bars, etcetera.

6. A clean, empty tin can be used to melt snow for water.

7. A cell phone if you can.

A last piece of advice. Drive with respect for the weather conditions. It my save your life and also prevent the need to use your safety equipment.

property. Texaco Canada operated a gas station on the site more than a decade ago - the property has been vacant since. Imperial Oil purchased Texaco in 1990. In 1939 Acton's Emily Bolton Goodchild sold the property to McCall Frontenac Oil which became Texaco. Texaco opened a gas station on the property on December 31, 1940.




