Holocaust Bill passes Legislature

Bill 66, an Act to Proclaim Holocaust Memorial Day, Yom Ha-Shoah, in Ontario, has been passed by the Ontario Legislature and will receive Royal Assent early in the New Year.

Halton North MPP Ted Chudleigh sponsored the private member's bill and shepherded it through the legislative process.

"I am very pleased to have had a part in enacting Holocaust Memorial Day in Ontario," said Chudleigh. "It is important to understand that by commemorating perhaps the largest, most brutal statesanctioned genocide in modern times, we are trying to call attention to all genocide."

"This happens over and over again. It happened in Cambodia, the Ukraine, Armenia, Africa, and in 1940 Europe," Chudleigh said. "Beginning in 1933, Nazis systematically stripped Jews of their rights. They were unable to hold public office or public sector jobs. Then they were banned from movie theatres, vacation resorts, specific areas of cities, and public schools. Soon public indifference led to Jewish businesses being damaged and eventually to physical violence and imprisonment."

Plans to develop a 32acres parcel off the campus of E.C. Drury School for the Deaf in Milton are subject to approval by the Town of Milton.
