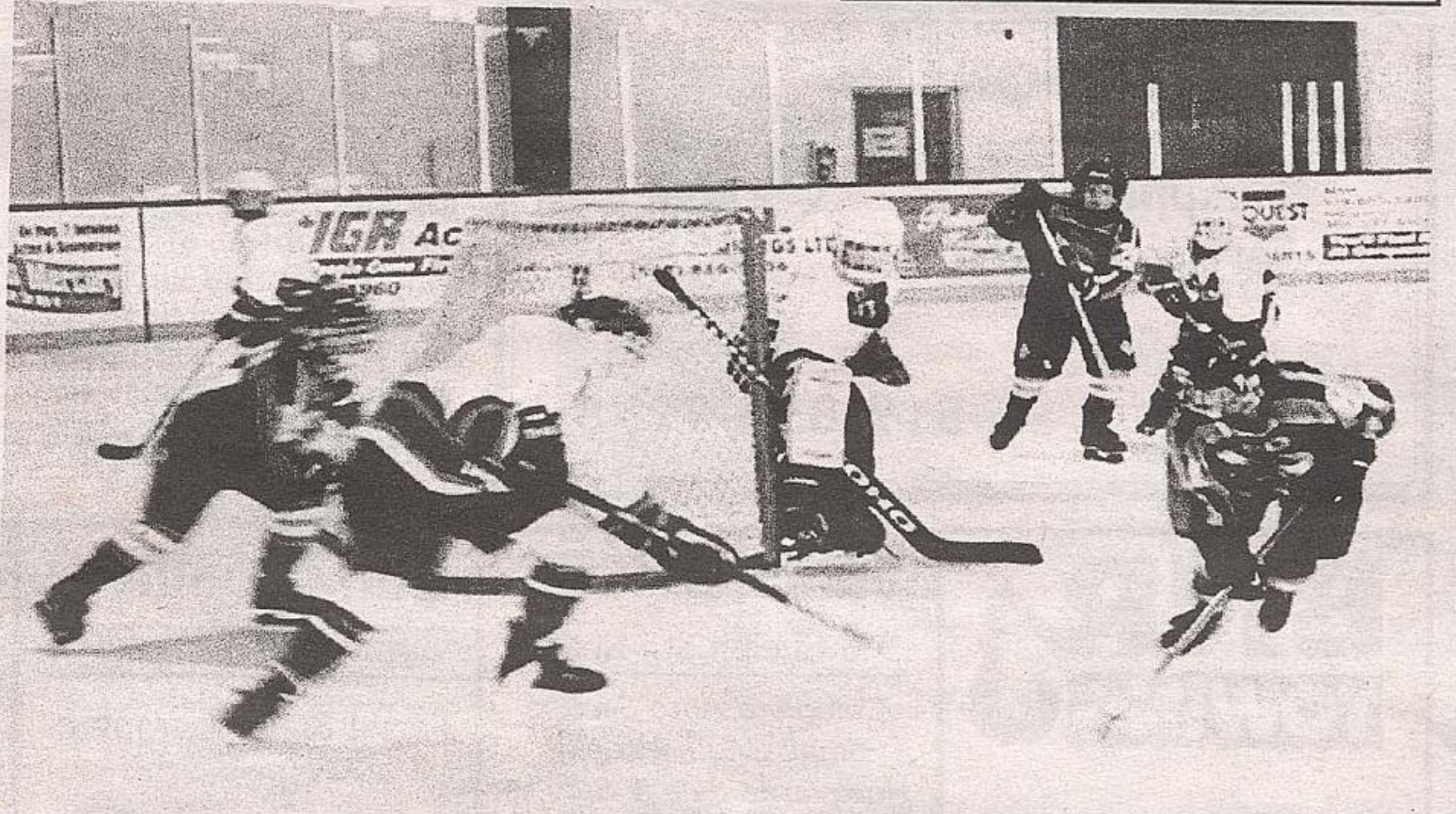

## Woolford hot for 'Canes

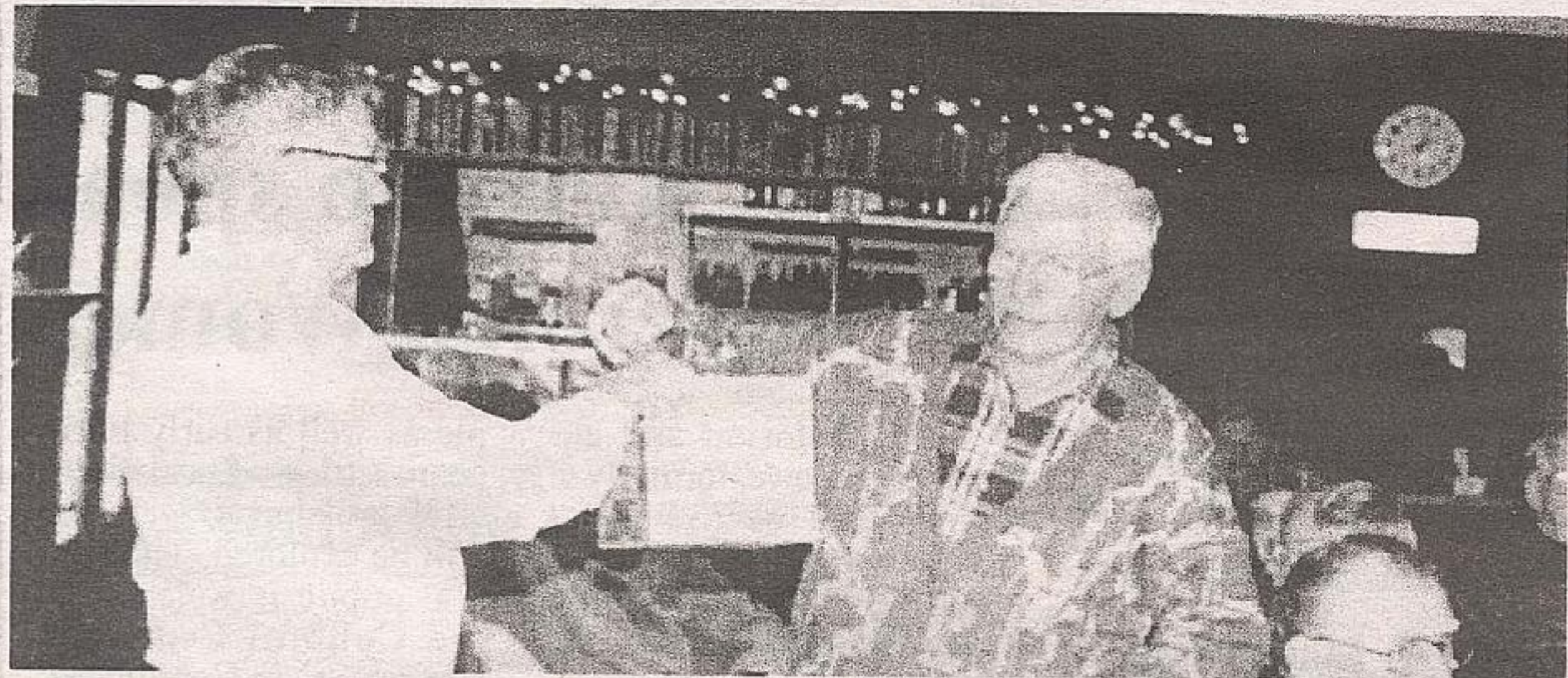

## \$150 fine for running light

Ontario Transportation Minister Tony Clement has introduced legislation to enable municipalities to set up pilot project to study the effectiveness of red light cameras.

The proposed legislation is only one part of a package of measures the province is developing to assist municipalities in testing the effectiveness of various approaches to improve intersection safety. Halton North MPP Ted Chudleigh said he agrees with the government's methodical approach to finding a solution to this problem.

"We need to understand the dynamics behind several suggested solutions to this

problem before we act definitively," Mr. Chudleigh said. "This tends to be more of a problem in very congested areas. Costs and effectiveness must be considered. Perhaps one remedy for this problem will not be effective across Ontario."

Clement said however, that a visible police presence is the best method to control red light running while ensuring that the offenders are properly ticketed. His plan for pilot project includes red light cameras to photograph licence plates of offending vehicles, and stepped up enforcement blitzes.

The province has recently introduced new measures including increased fines and

the introduction of Community Safety Zones. Ontario's Road Safety Plan includes more than 100 legislative, enforcement and public education initiatives aimed at cracking down on aggressive driving and improving safety.

The minimum fine for running a red or amber light has been increased from \$60 to \$150. The new legislation will allow red light running charges to be laid against either a driver or licence plate holder. It will also make it an offence to obstruct the plate.

Areas in which red light cameras will be allowed will be set by government regulations.
