The Town of Halton Hills' proposed new con-tract with its outside works staff has been "voted down like a ton of bricks."

Steve McKnight, president of CUPE Local 73 (Canadian Union of Public Employees), said employees in the arenas, public works and mechanics voted overwhelmingly against the Town offer last week. They

want wage parity for public works staffers with workers in similar positions in other jurisdictions.

Approximately 50 members have been without a contract since March.

The offer put before them Dec. 22 was reached with the assistance of a conciliation officer. Their rejection gives him the option of bringing in a no board report. Seventeen days after that report is filed workers could go on strike or the Town could lock them
