Pre-engineering work begins on the \$6 million reconstruction of Highway 7 from Acton to Georgetown. Provincial officials cite poor road conditions and a higher than average number of traffic accident fatalities as the reasons for the improvements:

§ Three Mississauga friends purchased the Red Dog Café from Acton's Steve and Carol Brunelle.

§ A group of Acton teens with nowhere to hang out, except on the street, is looking for support to open a drop-in centre at the old Prospect Park arena. Halton Hills Support Services and Information (formerly ASSIC) also struck a committee recently to look into opening a youth drop-in centre in Acton.

§ The Acton Agricultural Society asks Town council to reallocate money earmarked for demolition of the prospect Park arena and instead use them to fix the ageing facility.

Highway 7 convinced budget committee members that their road is so unsafe that \$115,000 initially removed from the capital budget by Town staff, should be added back in this year's spending plan.






