## Former Acton resident rescues young kangaroo

Former Acton resident Mary-Jane (New) Gabelish, now in Australia, hit the headlines down under with her rescue of a young kangaroo which had fallen form its mother's pouch shortly before Christmas.

The injured "joey", as it's called, was found by a woman who took it to a Whiteman Park ranger who in turn phoned Malaga's Fauna Rehabilitation Foundation for assistance. The centre was closed but an answering machine message connected the ranger with fauna volunteer Mary-Jane Gabelish.

Mary-Jane picked up the joey, now dubbed Charlie, within a few hours and took it to a local vet who diagnosed a hind leg broken in two places. Surgery on the leg would cost \$400 (Australian).

Mary-Jane knew the foundation couldn't afford the \$400 but there was no way she was going to let him die. So she took money she received from husband Tony for Christmas and paid for the opera-

tion. The operation was a success and Charlie's recovery is almost complete with removal of the cast.
