The Acton Citizens' band played three songs in the prelude and joint adult and youth choirs led the hymns. In his sermon, titled "One in Heart and Mind" the Reverend Shawn Brix of Bethel Christian Reformed Church, chair of the Acton Ministerial, read from Acts 4:23-32, which includes what is believed to be the earliest recorded prayer.

"The disciples knew that Christian unity was the context in which prayer was to take place. Unity was the context in which God's power could be released," Rev. Brix said, asking how are the 6 or 7,000 Actonites who weren't at the services going to hear and see the love of God and the gospel of Je-

"If we, Christ's followers, pray with one heart and mind asking God to equip us with his power, then God will hear our prayer and use us to make his presence experienced in our community."

Brix said that the prayers of Acton's church communities lack power if they aren't in accord with one another.

"When there's unresolved tensions between us our prayers are largely ineffective. If harmony is missing, so is power," Brix said, adding that they have a mutual calling and task, but they aren't trying to become one and "muster up some unity," but to express and celebrate their unity.

"Unity isn't a goal - it's a given and our goal is to express that unity."

Timing of service hinders Catholics

Father Dave Reilander told parishioners at three masses on the weekend that St. Joseph's could not officially take part in the unity service on Sunday because the time was inconvenient.

I asked the ministerial association twice to change the time so I could attend as well as our parishioners but they refused, he said.

Catholics have an obligation to attend mass on Sundays and their worship is in the celebration of the Eucharist and the reception of communion. The Protestant churches have a different form of worship and are able to adjust to the 10 a.m. time of the unity service, he said. However, he has an obligation to say mass for the Catholic people and the masses on Sundays are at 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. as well as Saturdays at 5 p.m.

Parishioners who were able to attend the unity service did so on their own, he
