
# Olympics at March Break



Elliott said, adding that he shares their fears.

The very ambitious proposed capital budget that was presented to councillors for debate totalled \$7.8 million with the lion's share - \$3.2 million - earmarked for pub-

lic work projects and \$1.1 million for recreation and parks projects.

The budget committee, consisting of all councillors and the mayor, were expected of the capital spending plan.

One contentious issue

with Acton councillors will be \$200,000 earmarked for pre-engineering design work for a proposed leisure centre, a staff recommendation which received luke-warm response from the Acton politicians at the last budget meeting.





Both Re-Entry and Summit House staff are also looking for local beds along with staff of Community Living of North Halton and Community Care Access centre (formerly Home Care) is looking for nursing beds for some residents.

"Generally, what they're going to do is take the residents out to have a look at some of these places and hopefully, give people some choices about where they may be going."

Wayne Palmer, a spokesperson for the receiver, said Village Manor, which is operating at a loss, will be closed because it needs a lot of repairs and modernization to bring it up to current standards and the receiver has concluded that further investment is not advisable, at this time.

"We not in a position to discuss that (rebuilding) at this point. Nothing is really firm," Palmer said, adding that they must get approval from the Ontario Court of Justice to officially close the home.

The 12 full and part-time employees at Village Manor have been given layoff notices, effective in June.
