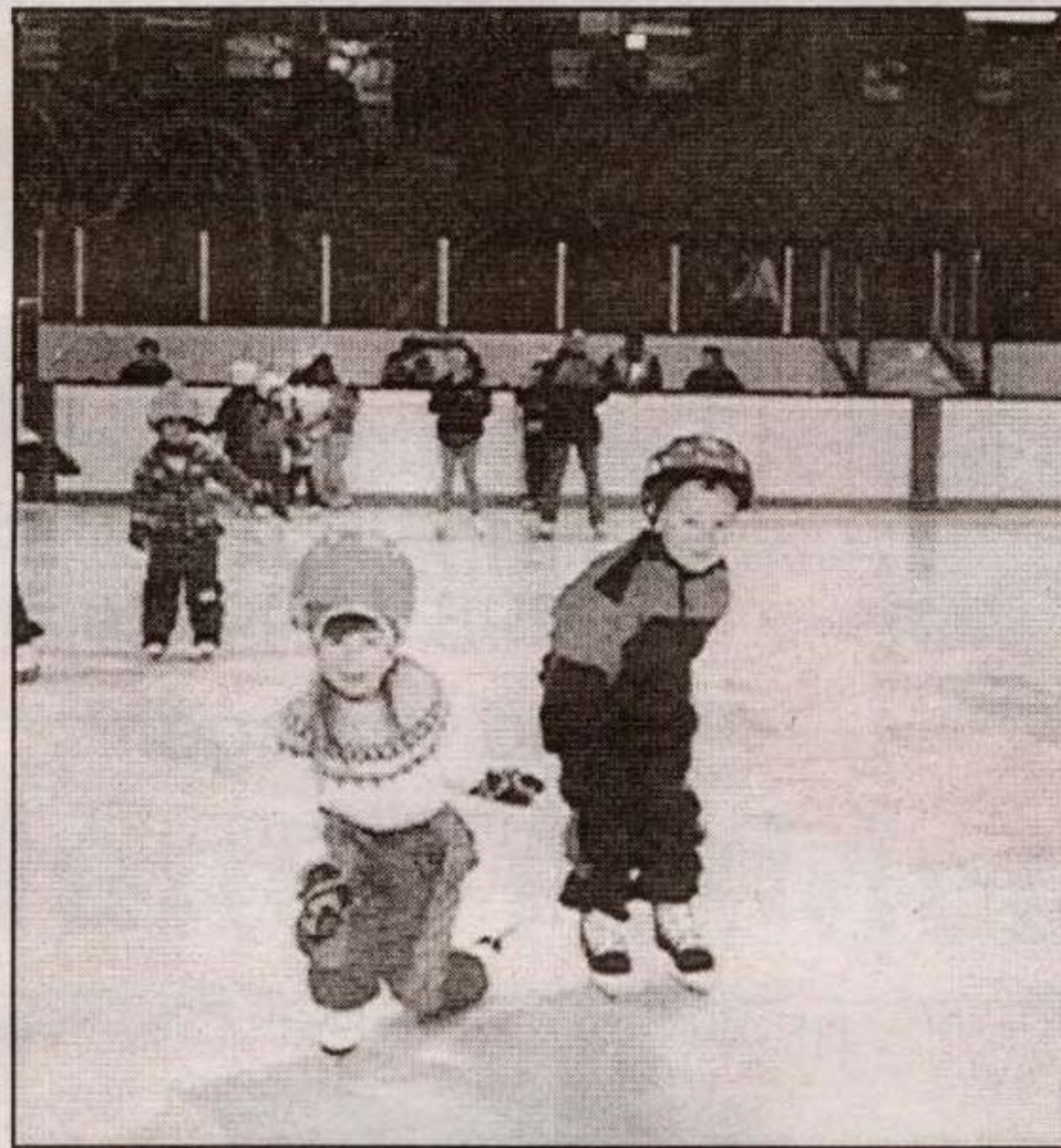

## Fairy lake dam park plan

Imagine a lazy rest beside a rushing waterfall along with a landscaped shoreline — that's what the Town would like to see at the dam on Fairy Lake along Mill Street East. The \$111,000 dam rehabilitation project, approved by Town Council last year but not done because of a staff shortage, will include new concrete reinforcements; replacement of the stop-logs [water level control devices] on the top of the dam and landscaping. The work could begin this spring.

"Hopefully we can take the (chain link) fence down and give people a little bit better access to the site," explained Bryan Shynal, the Town's Manager of Recreation and Parks.

"I think people want to be able to access the edge of the lake," Shynal said, adding

that barrier rails will be installed at critical points for safety.

"We're not getting the recreational advantages out of this site in terms of being able to access the safe portions, and I think it will look a lot better once the rehabilitation work is done," Shynal said.

A recent legal notice from the Town on behalf of the Ministry of Fisheries and Oceans gives anyone with an objection to the work, based on possible effects on marine navigation, until March 18 to submit comments to the Coast Guard.

Early in the 1800s, what is now Fairy Lake was nothing more than a wide spot in Black Creek. The dam was built around 1830 to provide power for a sawmill, then a flour mill and finally the Beardmore Tannery.

Canada Packers deeded the 88-acre lake to the Town in 1990.
