## Ambulance service saved

Concerns the volunteer ambulance service in Halton Hills could be disbanded appear to be unfounded. At council on Monday night, Halton Hills CEO Steve Andrews said he expects a Regional staff report on the future of ambulance services, expected March 24, will recommend maintaining the volunteer service in Halton

That's great news for Acton Councillor Rick Bonnette who noted that a consultant hired by Halton Region came to the conclusion that the volunteer system is a closely knit group that forms an important part of the fabric of the community.

The province ran the ambulance service until it downloaded the responsibility to upper tier governments like Halton Region. Halton Hills is unique in Halton because it has a volunteer service, manned by 64 level 1 paramedics. The Acton ambulance station, located at the rear of Beckers, is staffed from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. daily

"Negotiations are going well with Heritage Acton to locate the Acton Youth Centre within the Town Hall -Fire Hall complex," Dowell said following a meeting with Heritage Acton officials last week.

The concept for the Youth Centre is to have one-stop shopping for youth services during the day and a drop-in centre at night.

"We're looking to make this work together, as a partnership," Dowell said recently, adding that HHCSI wants to rent more of the building in a phased manner,

Dowell said the next step is for Heritage Acton to determine how much it will cost to do its part to make the Dowell, executive of the space ready for the Youth Halton Hills Community Centre. Heritage Acton Support and Information spokesman Ted Tyler said Service (HHCSI), which will once the flat roof over the Fire Hall is repaired - the contract could be awarded in early March - the Youth Centre will move into what was the fire chief's office and a lounge.

Until the downstairs of the fire hall is brought up to current building and fire standards and a new heating system installed, which could cost up to \$100,000, the upstairs auditorium and the fire truck bay area can't be occupied.

"I'd like to see everything completed this year. It's possible but how probable - I don't know, because we're looking for some funds to help us with this job and I don't know how soon those funds will be available, if at all," Tyler said.
