Halton business centre helps entrepreneurs

Business activity remained at a high level in 1998 for the Region of Halton's Business Development Centre.

Over 13,700 entrepreneurs received assistance from the Business Development Centre. The different types of assistance included: personalized consultations; general inquiries; seminars; and bus9iness registrations.

Approximately 10-20 businesses were registered daily in Halton. Throughout 1998, Halton's Business Development Centre was ranked as one of the busiest offices in Ontario in terms of Business registrations, resulting in 2,666 registrations at year end.

As part of the Centre's commitment to support and enhance Halton's existing economic base, the Business Development Centre continued with its Corporate Calling program. In 1998, approximately 40 Halton businesses were visited pro-

viding an exchange of information for both the business community and the Business Development Centre.

Over 20 information forums, including presentations; seminars; and special events were well attended by over 600 businesspeople.

The Business Development Centre is also responsible for the marketing and promoting of Ontario Works - Halton to the non-profit and private sector organizations in Halton. In 1998, 201 Ontario Works participants were placed into community placements.

The Halton Business Development Centre has been developing partnerships with the public, non-profit, and the private sectors and will shift from the Provincial Small Business Self-help Office model to the Small Business Enterprise Centre model. Work is underway to establish more partnerships as a means to deliver new programs or services for

small business. One is the establishment of a satellite office of the Business Development Centre at the Ontario ministry of Agriculture, Food, and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA) office in

The intent of this partnership with OMAFRA is to build on the complementary mandates of both parties, to increase the accessibility of small business services to Halton Hills and parts of Milton, and to develop new small business programs of Cont. on Pg. 15.


