Stricken children benefit from Child's Wish project

A Child's Wish of Halton Hills (formerly known as Make-A-Wish of Halton Hills) is a non-profit organization with one goal - to brighten the lives of children stricken with serious and lifethreatening illnesses. It tries to grant every child it can, his or her single, special wish.

Founded in 1983 by the NHL's Director Officiating, Bryan Lewis, it is entirely voluntary. Fortunately, A Child's Wish of Halton Hills has not had the need to grant any wishes lately, but the organization would like the growing community of Halton Hills to know they are here and willing to assist the children.

Who does A Child's Wish of Halton Hills help?

Any child of Halton Hills, under 18, who has been diagnosed with a serious and life-threatening illness, could have a wish granted by A Child's Wish. The child's disease, condition, background and financial situation do not matter. All A Child's Wish of Halton Hills requires are the physician's and family's permission to help and the resources to do so. The time, effort and money put into A Child's

Wish is used only for children in Halton Hills.

How do you go about granting a wish?

A Child's Wish of Halton hills created a "bank" or resources: money, volunteer time and talent, empty seats on airplanes, accommodations at hotels and so forth. "Wish children" can be referred by almost anyone: doctors, friends, family or service agencies. A special committee reviews referrals, interviews potential wish recipients and tries to fulfill

wishes as quickly and completely as possible.

What sort of wishes are granted?

A Child's Wish of Halton Hills has granted several wishes over the years. Some of which are: attending a concert, trips to summer camp, visiting Canada's Wonderland, transportation costs, assisting to send a young girl to Disney World, and Christmas gifts to children at Georgetown District Memorial Hospital.








The master bedroom, like those in larger homes, features a walk-in closet and a three piece ensuite.
