

Bicycles

The season for bicycling is just beginning. Here are some tips and things to think about before getting on that bike and headoing out on the road.

Each year we have a high incidence of bicycle thefts. Most of the stolen bikes were not locked when taken. Also the bicycle owner did not have a serial number and sometimes did not know the make and model. Take the time right now and write down your bicycle's serial number and other identification, descriptio and make and model!

Several bicycles are recovered each year and turned over to Halton Regional Police Service. They belong to someone but have not been identified. Evenutally they will be sold at auction.

Remember, bicycle helmets are mandatory for person up to 18 year of age, and further Section 104 (2.2) of the Highway Traffic Act states the parent or guardian of a eprson under 16 years who permits the child to ride a bicycle without a helmet is subject to a charge under this section.

Bicycles are not allowed on the sidewalk. When being ridden, bicycles must be travelling on the right side of the road, the same as a motor vehicel, and must stop for stop signs and red lights and are subject to the same fines as the driver of a motor vehicle.

Parents please take the time to talk to your children about safe cycling and if you ride, set a good example.
