

Welland man falls to death

A Welland man is the latest victim of Rattlesnake Point near Milton.

The 26-year-old, climbing up the face of the Niagara Escarpment cliff, fell 50 or 60 feet to his death last Saturday.

Police, fire and ambulance responded to a call for

help and an air ambulance transported the victim to the top of the Rattlesnake Point cliff. By the time he arrived at the cliff top there were no vital signs and attempts to

revive him by emergency personnel were unsuccessful.

He was pronounced dead at the scene by coroner Dr. Robertson. He was identified as Frank Minniti, 26,

Milton shooting

Halton Regional Police Service in Milton is investi-

gating the shooting of a 16-year-old Halton Hills resident in Milton last Friday evening. The victim received minor injuries when he was shot in the shoulder. He was treated at hospital and released.

The youth was in Rotary Park in Milton when he was approached by two males. One produced a handgun and demanded his wallet. When he refused he was shot in the shoulder with a small calibre handgun. Both suspects fled on foot.

The victim returned to a social event where was at prior to going to the park. He was eventually taken to the Milton District Hospital where he was treated and released. Police were also called at this time.
