New name, new season for Bulldogs minor lacrosse

The newly amalgamated Halton Hills Bulldogs Minor Lacrosse Association kicks off play May 1 at the Acton arena. Bulldogs house league action began April 17 in Georgetown.

The Acton Rams and Georgetown have suspended separate rep league play and joined to form one league with rep and alternate entry teams for each category, tyke to midget.

Rams past president George Artem predicts the

amalgamation will mean a better calibre of play and more opportunities for players to join rep teams.

"Until now, Acton and Georgetown could only field one rep team and some times we were short three or four players," Artem said.

"Now we're fielding two per division and the first teams will be rated higher and there will be a good calibre between the Acton and Georgetown mix," Artem said, adding there were only minor

hiccups as both clubs "gave away their identifies" to become the Bulldogs, the name of the junior lacrosse team in Halton Hills.

Approximately 400 players are registered with the Bulldogs this year, 100 of them from Acton. Artem said combining the leagues and some prime time coverage of professional lacrosse action have combined to boost registration for the entire league by over 100 players from last

"Travis was truly on cloud nine with 99," Mrs. McDowell said.


