I read with concern the article in The Tanner last week regarding the Region going to flush out the watermains in Acton and Georgetown. I read further that they are going to use a foam cylinder and dump the effluent in the storm sew-

A number of the storm sewers in Acton dump into Fairy Lake. I am deeply concerned that, with the lack of rain this year, what it will do to the quality of the water in Fairy Lake?

Part of the water supply of Acton comes from under Fairy Lake. If I remember correctly, the government made the water works run their pumps at full capacity for a certain number of days, before they gave their permission to put it into service, so they could see how much the lake went down. So I would assume some water in the lake seeps into the deep down water supply.

I would also like to know if the region still uses aluminium - silicate in the water treatment

as stated in The Acton Free Press many years ago when the park water supply first went on the line, to sequester some minerals out of the wa-

I notice the government is having second thoughts, as aluminium is thought to have something to do with Alzheimer's Disease.




