



Father Angelo Valeriote is honoured on 50th anniversary

Well over 200 former parishioners, family, friends and priestly colleagues feted Pastor Emeritus of St. Joseph's Church at a mass and subsequent dinner Sunday on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood.

Now retired after 10 years as pastor of the Acton parish, Father Angelico Valeriote was described as a paragon of kindness and concern for others by speaker after speaker at the dinner at the Royal Canadian Legion, following the three o'clock mass of thanksgiving in the church. In a humorous program with Father Peter Waters of Rockwood as master of ceremonies, fellow priests lauded his concern for others and made passing references to his lead foot on the accelcrator.

An Acton teen will be one of a group going to Africa from June 18 to July 5 to do Youth in Mission work with the Presbyterian Church in Canada.

Mary Beth Robertson, 18, is one of five youths and five adults going to Malawi to build a house with Habitat for Humanity. They will also visit seven child care centres in the country for kids who have HIV or lost their parents to HIV or AIDS.

Robertson learned about the trip from a minister who visited the congregation earlier this year. She applied and was accepted after an inter-

Last weekend she attended a meeting in Toronto with the other nine group members to get acquainted and learn something about the culture of Malawi.

"It was largely educational," Robertson says, "because their culture is so different. We have to expect a

Right now she is viewing the trip as "an opportunity." Whether the experience will give her a career direction before it's over, who knows.
