## Milton men arrest for robbery

Two Milton men have been arrested in connection with two robberies of a Milton Credit Union, the first on May 18, and the second on June 9, 1999. Both were arrested without incident.

On May 8, a masked man

entered the Halton Community Credit Union on Main St. E., in Milton. He produced a shotgun and demanded money from the staff. An undisclosed amount of money was turned over to him and he fled. On June 8

the Credit Union was robbed again in the same fashion.

The men were arrested on June 9

Charged are Kenneth Stephens, 38, of Commercial St., Milton and Hallen King, 44, of Ontario St., Milton.

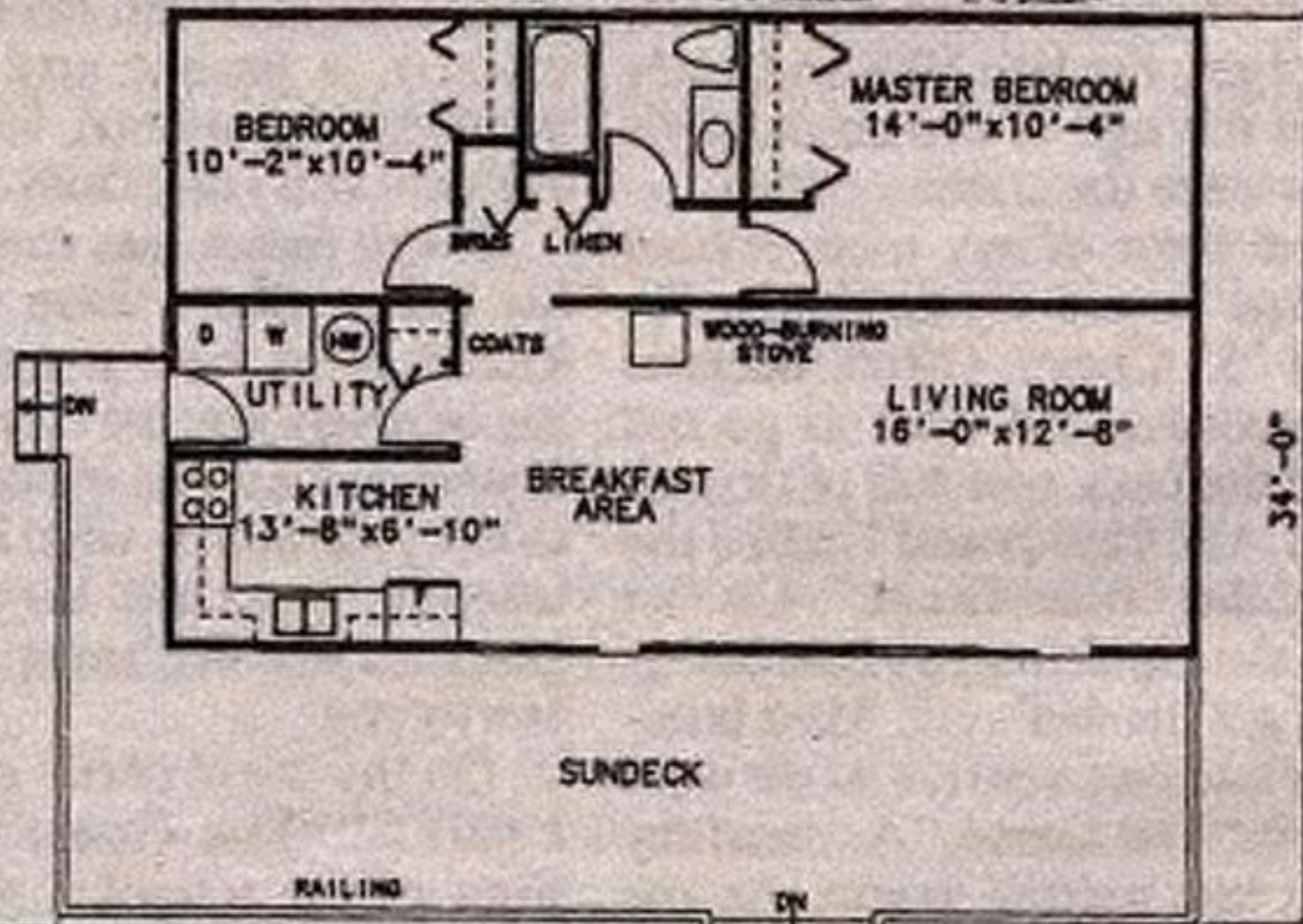
