gles. Geordie Fleming and Philip Romanet scored for Sargent.

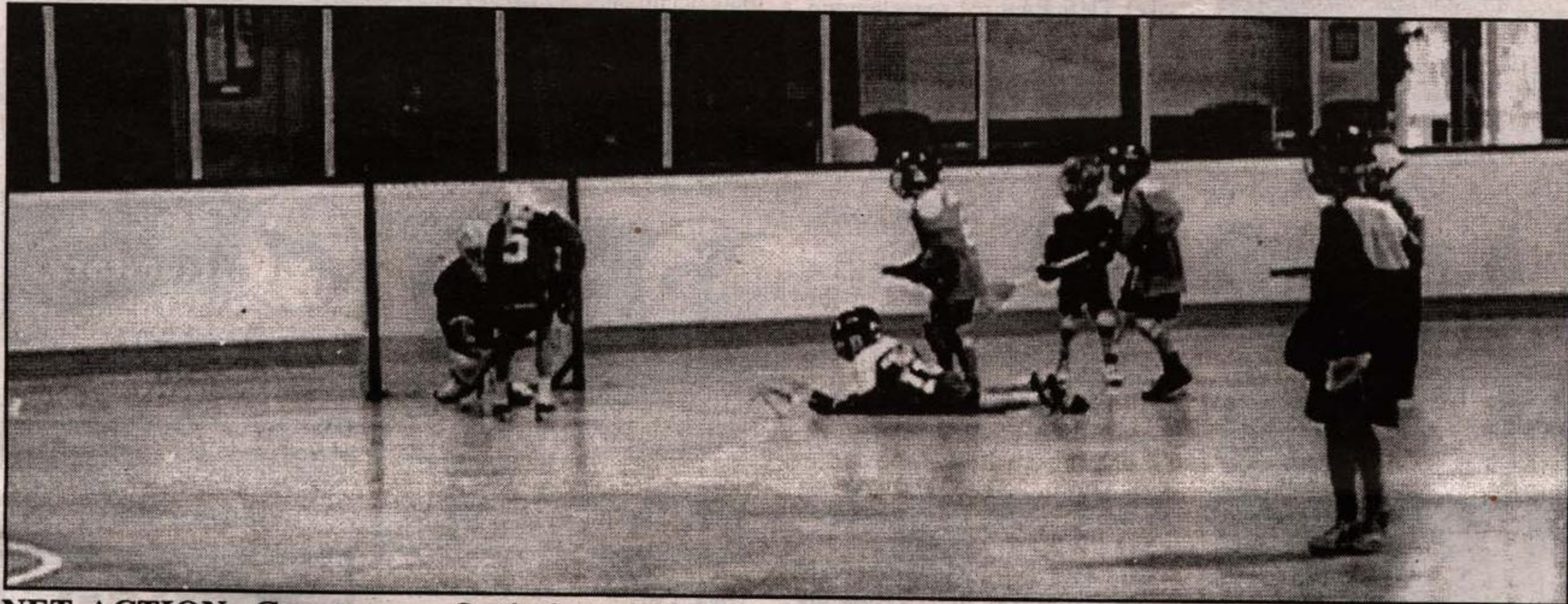
NOVICE

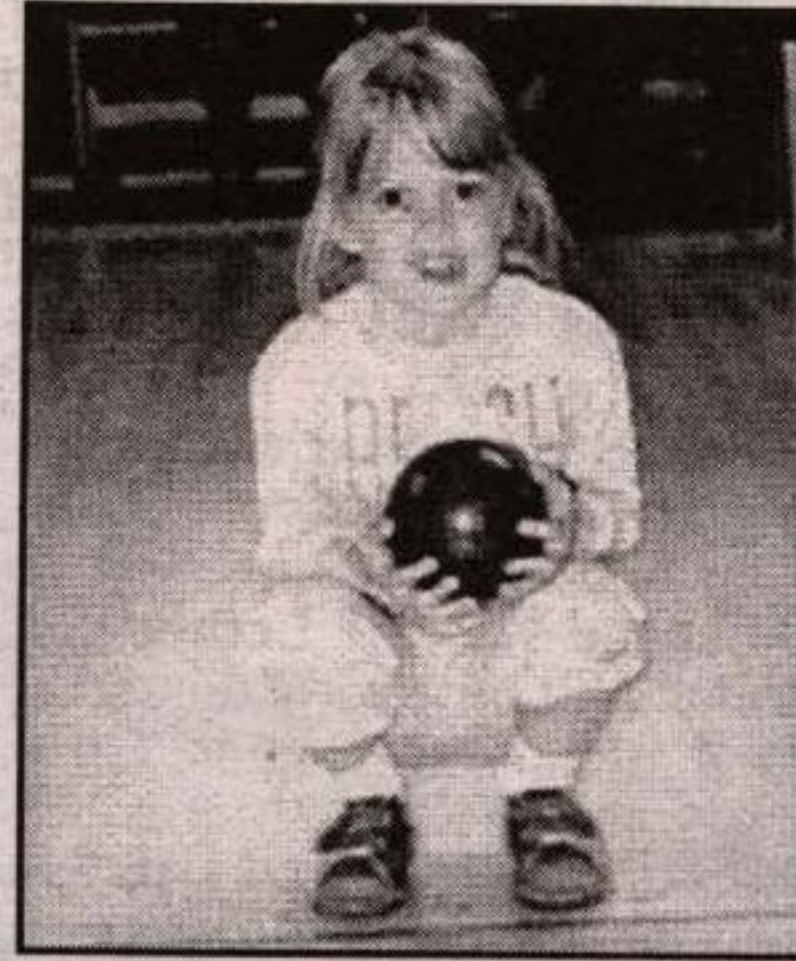

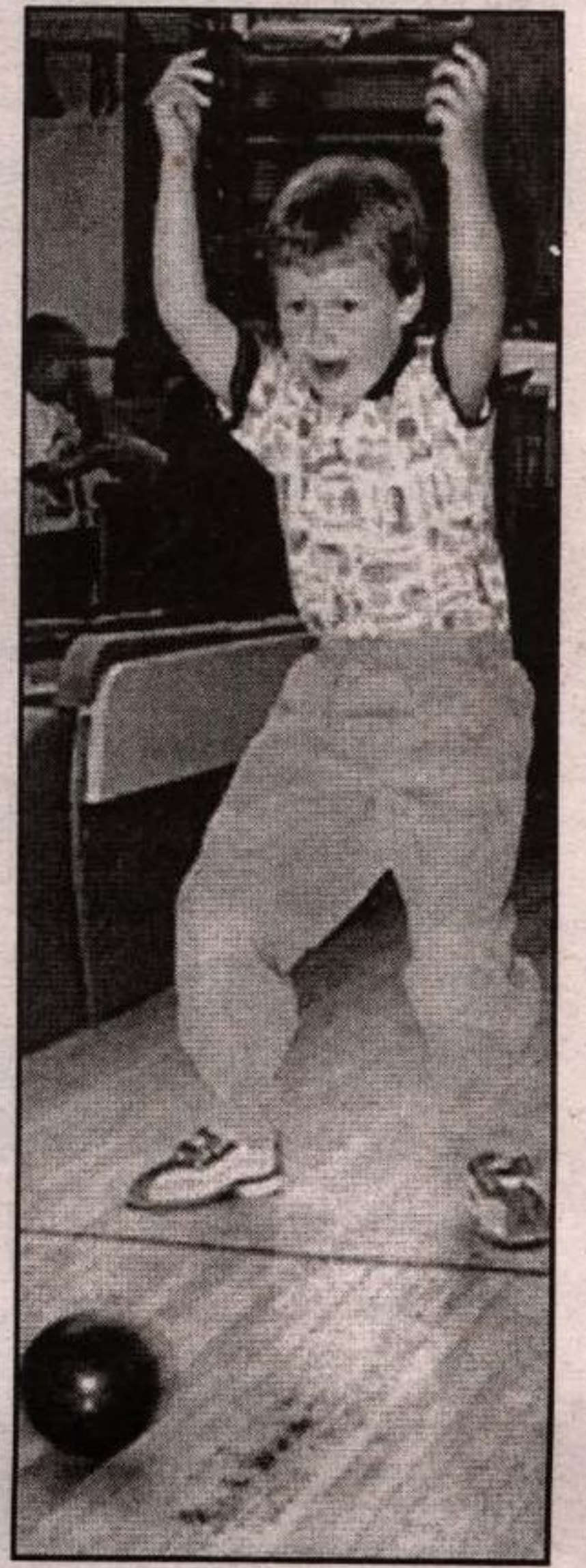
