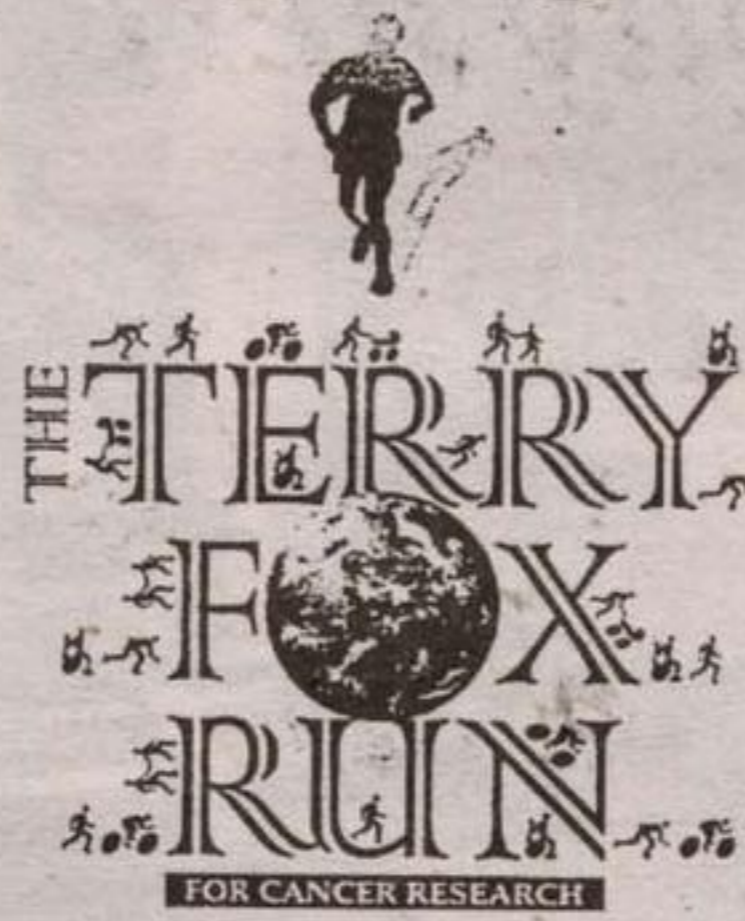


# Terry Fox's mother to kick off Fox Run campaign

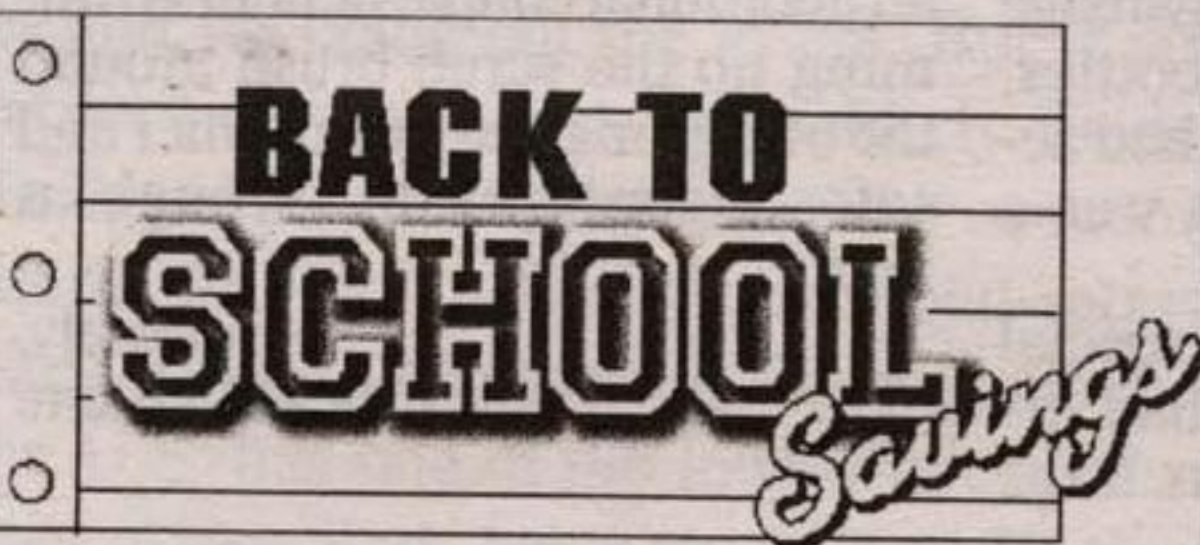

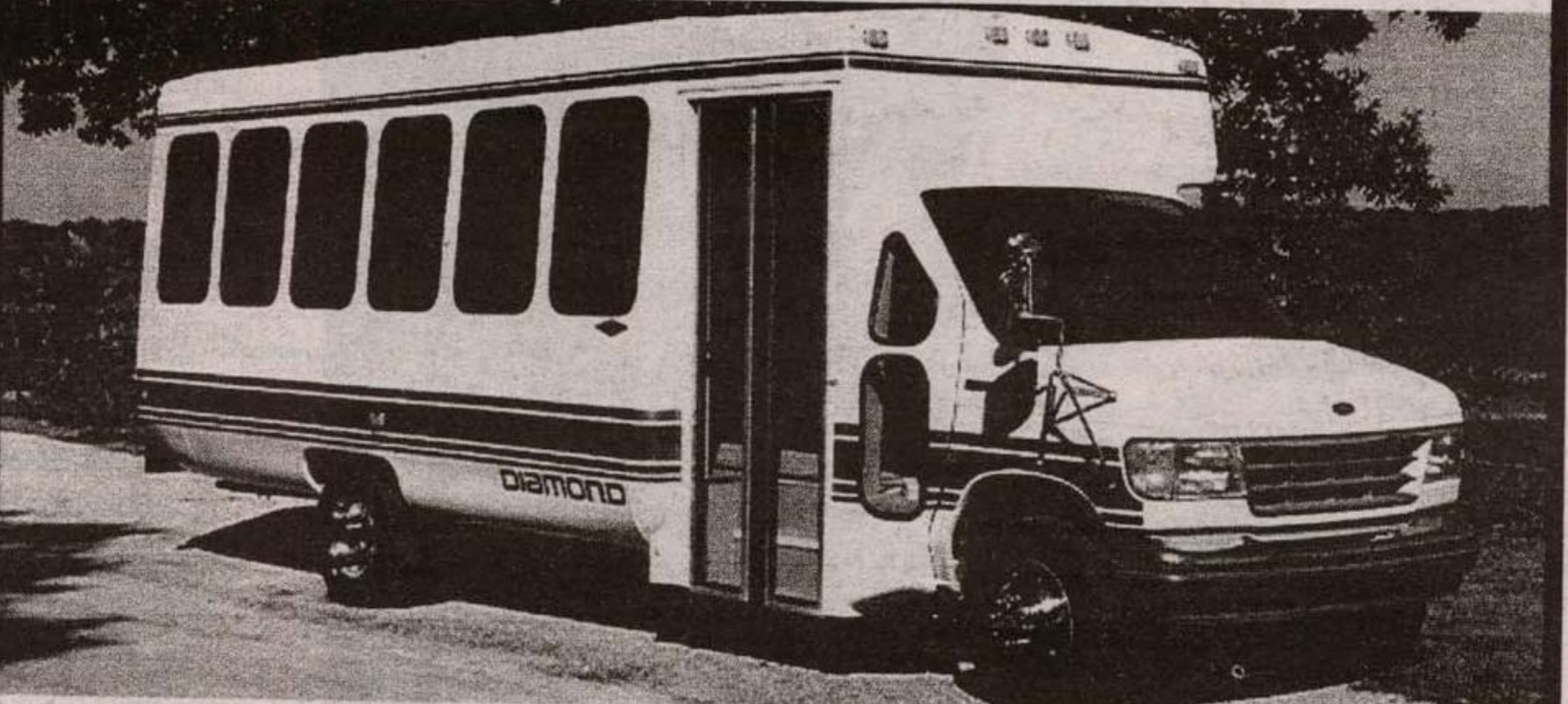
